And let's not beat around the bush, they'll be much better up front than Luton are right now!



But in the away section at Kenilworth Road you only get a choice between restricted view seats and very restricted view seats go to any part of the stand and you still won't see the whole pitch because of the pillars.

At the last Luton v Palace game I couldn't see the whole of either goal, but then I guess that was probably a good thing.
