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

Half-time Orange will be back for the Sunderland game. Let's just hope there's still something to play for. Hmm.

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

end of the 1978/79

gifted the Hatters own goals in four consecutive games Step forward Gary Williams (Brighton) **Dave Roberts** (Cardiff), Sean Haslegrave (Stoke) and John Beck (Fulham) as their efforts earned the Town the points which saved them from relegation to the old Division

IN the immediate aftermath of Mike Newell's sacking, Three Counties Radio's Drive Time programme had been debating the Town board's decision. Host Ronnie Barbour broke off to play an advertising trailer promoting the station's coverage of Hatters' next match in which commentator Euan Duncan said "Mike

Newell will be hoping his men can bounce back from midweek defeat". Then on came the axed manager talking about how he needed to turn things around quickly. Talk about scoring a bit of an own goal!

DURING an FA Cup fourth round tie with Bradford City at Kenilworth Road in 1974, the unlucky Bantams defender David Fretwell scored an own goal after only 15 seconds. A City player had yet to touch the ball when the Town's Tom Finney sent in a hard cross which Fretwell crashed past his own goalkeeper.

IN a Division Three (South) game at the ill-fated

Thames Association in December 1930 the attendance reached a massive 469. The Town's 20% share of the gate receipts was 1/8d (8p) and the club's directors had the Postal Order framed!



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

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

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
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
