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





book launch, to get bored with his new play thing in next to no time & send him back to Liverpool.



no less than made league debuts for the Hatters since the start of that season. Forming part of the up-coming Joe Kinnear revolution were Carl Emberson, Russ Perrett, Kevin Nicholls, Paul Hughes, Carl Griffiths, lan Hillier, Adrian Forbes, Chris Coyne, Jean-Louis Valois, Dean **Crowe and Ahmet** Brkovic. Coyne and Brkovic are, of course,

In the 3-3 draw at Liverpool in 1982 the Town used three different goalkeepers who each conceded a goal. Normal goalkeeper Jake Findlay was injured after conceding the first Reds goal, with his

replacement Kirk 'Shakin' Stephens (as dubbed by the Kop) letting in number two. Stephens was spared further humiliation in the second half when Mal Donaghy took over between the sticks but he was powerless to prevent the third Liverpool goal.

The Town's F.A. Cup tie with Blackpool in 1953 needed three replays before it was settled. A total of 106,232 spectators witnessed this epic encounter.

In December 1934 the Town went 0-3 down at Southend after hard-man full-back Tom Mackey was sent off for disputing a penalty. So fired up were the Hatters players that they managed to fight back to 3-3.

WE'VE laid into Adam Boyd so many times that reader Peter Elkington has leapt to his defence... claiming he's not Town's worst-ever signing.

Instead Peter put forward the name of Jimmy Jinks, a centre-forward who, quite frankly, we thought he'd made up... after all. who'd want a player called Jinx in their line-up?

Signed from Fulham for a 'nominal' fee (code for a set of training bibs and a couple of balls), he made his debut at Kenilworth Road in a Second Division 2-1 win against Bury on March 4, 1950. He didn't

Jimmy played the next three games and proved a Jinx as the games at Tottenham and Blackburn and the home match with

WE'VE suffered plenty of bad luck over the years - especially with the conceding of late karma for Bruno's cup final last-kick winner against Arsenal). But back in the 1950s Hatters had their own Jinx, a player by the name of Jimmy Yes, I know you've never heard of him, but read on...

Cardiff all finished goalless. Jimmy did a disappearing act from the teamsheet for

the rest of that season. Records suggest this was initially due to illness and then down to the form of George Stobbart. He then didn't resurface until the sixth match of the 1950-51 campaign.

Jinx then played five matches on the spin, but Town didn't win any of them



- although he did score in the first two games of that sequence a 2-1 home

defeat to Hull and a 6-1 reverse at Barnslev.

Jimmy played nine games and scored two goals before he was transferred to Aldershot in September 1951 He's described in the archives as "a clever ball player who can crack the ball hard with either foot"... perhaps he was related to Johnny Vilstrup!

He bagged a single goal in five starts for 'Shots before vanishing off the football radar.

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

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


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
