With us so far adrift now, you wouldn't put it past the authorities to save up the penalties until next





LEIGHTON Buzzardborn Alan Biley joined the Hatters from school but. playing on the left wing, did little to impress boss Harry **Haslam and when** the club disbanded their vouth team for financial reasons, he was left out in the cold.

Former Luton coach Paddy Sowden, by now assistant to Ron **Atkinson at Cambridge United,** had been alerted and signed Biley on a free transfer in

1975 and on the opening day of the 1975/76 season he came off the bench to lay on a goal and then score himself.

Between 1976 and 1979, Biley became the first player to be leading scorer for his club for three consecutive seasons in three different divisions as United stormed up from Division **Four to Division** Two.

Such was his goalscoring prowess that the big clubs came sniffing and a £350,000 fee took him to Derby in 1980 and a similar cheque took him to **Everton a year** later.

It was at Portsmouth. though, that Alan enjoyed probably his best spell, with a goal in every other game in three **years at Fratton** Park.

Since hanging up his boots Alan has managed several clubs at non-league level and is

currently in charge of Spalding Town still sporting the same dodgy barnet that he had back in the 1980s!






