**MICK Harford** said the 3-0 defeat at Wrexham this season was the worst performance in Hatters' history. Here we continue our series of articles where fans pick out their own nightmares. This time it's Ian Morris's turn.

Notts County (a), 1-2, 02/05/92: My first experience of watching Luton get relegated. A typical away scenario... Town take the lead and throw it away. Also memorable due to the friend who drove us to Notts almost

getting arrested after the game. He started shouting at someone who was laughing at our result. A copper stepped in and he started shouting at him too. Fortunately he calmed down and we got home.

Chelsea (Wembley), FA Cup semi, 0-2, 09/04/94: My first trip to Wembley and we lost. Luton were absolutely hopeless. I don't recall us having a shot in the entire game. The only consolation was that Chelsea got thumped 4-0 by Man Utd in the final.

Spurs (a), 1-4, 16/11/91: Everyone remembers this one. Luton play very well until the floodlights fail in the second half with Town leading 1-0. Spurs bring their players off the pitch. Luton keep theirs on it. When the game resumes Spurs are on fire as Hatters are caught cold. We're demolished and it all seemed mightily unfair.

Charlton (a), League Cup. 4-4, 23/09/03: Town take a 2-0 lead and end up 4-4 after extra time. Then we lose 6-5 on penal-

ties. A great game but I'll remember it for being taunted on the train station platform by Charlton fans and eventually getting home at 1.30am.

Cardiff (a), FA Cup, 2-1, 20/02/94: It's a stadium and a team I will never want to see again. Fantastic result. However a pitch invasion by the home fans who were baving for our blood at the final whistle took the gloss off and was fairly terrifying. Luckily I wasn't in the coach that had its windows smashed.





no chance, along with many other fans and, if memory serves, Richard Money himself. It's therefore great testament that we're in the position we are.





CAPPED: Syd Owen was picked for England three times

SYD Owen had signed on with his home city club Birmingham as the war ended but due to the large number of professionals on the books at St Andrews at the time he found it difficult to claim a first team spot.

Desperate for regular football, Owen jumped at the chance to join Luton and the Hatters' gain became Birmingham's loss as he enjoyed a 12-year spell at Kenilworth Road as a player, culminating in skippering the side at Wembley in the 1959 FA Cup final.

Although Owen started out at Luton as a wing-half, he moved to centre-half two years later when it became apparent that his abilities in the air meant that he was made for central defence.

Aside from his mastery in the air he showed cool distribution skills as well as long legs that seemed to snake out to dispossess many an opposition forward.

Syd was picked for England three times and played in the 1954 World Cup and would certainly have gained more caps but for the automatic selection of Wolves' Billy Wright in the centre-half berth at the time.

Owen took the Hatters into the old Division One in 1955 and played his final game when captaining the side in the 1959

FA Cup final at Wembley against Nottingham Forest.

It was common knowledge that Owen was to assume the manager's job at Kenilworth Road after the cup final but the new season started badly and got steadily worse. The team had grown old together and the reluctance of the board to spend money meant that it was a miserable campaign ending in relegation.

Owen resigned at this point but picked up his career again at Leeds where his coaching abilities came to the fore, assisting Don Revie to make the Yorkshire side the team of the 1960s.
