All I can say is, I hope he was extinguished quicker than the blaze that burnt down the Queen Vic in Eastenders, otherwise Pilkington will have to get used to playing centre-mid a little more regularly...







Blast from the past

Roger Wash looks back to see how the **Town fared on this** day in years gone by

Luton Town 3 Swindon Town 0 (September 28, 2002)

Following a highly successful 2001/02 campaign, which saw the Town bounce back to Division Two at the first attempt. the new season got off to a terrible start.

Four straight defeats were suffered as the players failed to come to terms with the quicker pace of League Two and pessimists at Kenilworth Road were predicting relegation by Christmas.

Manager Joe Kinnear read the riot act for two hours after the fourth defeat which seemed to work as a 0-0 draw was ground out at highly fancied Cardiff followed by the first win, with Chesterfield seen off 3-0 at Kenilworth Road.

The revival was fragile though as only two points were

picked up in the next three games before a fortunate 1-0 victory at Huddersfield brought a huge sigh of relief from the travelling supporters.


Next up at Kenilworth Road were a Swindon side who had enjoyed a good win over Northampton the previous week and were hoping to have turned the corner themselves.

The first half was complete one-way traffic with Steve

Howard netting his eighth of the season before Andrew Fotiadis, making his first start for nearly two years, spurned three good opportunities to give the half-time scoreline an unrealistic look.

The Luton supporters were worried that the missed opportunities would come back to bite them but two minutes into the second period the frustrating Fotiadis scored with a far more difficult chance than he had been presented with earlier and the confidence flowed through the side once more.

In truth, the Town could have netted a hatful against woeful opposition but had to be content with one further goal when substitute Dean Crowe was tripped in the area leaving Steve Robinson to net confidently from the spot.
