Anyway, the game also marks one year in the job for Richard Money. What might he







Blast from the past

October 30, 2004 **Luton Town 4 Bradford City 0**

THE Town started the 2004-05 season like a runaway train winning 10 and drawing two of their first 12 games and quite naturally sat proudly top of the League One table.

Game 13 saw the train slightly derailed when Huddersfield deservedly won 2-1 at Kenilworth Road against a lacklustre Town but the alarm bells started ringing when the Hatters went down 2-0 to a Paul Merson-inspired Walsall.

If the alarm bells were ringing following the Saddlers defeat

they were positively jangling when the Town lost 3-0 on their first-ever visit to the KC Stadium, Hull.

In mitigation one of the Hull goals was a fluke - a cross that deceived keeper Dino Seremet and flew into the top corner. Another followed a comedy defensive error while skipper Kevin Nicholls was controversially dismissed.

After three defeats in a week there was much hand wringing amongst the Luton supporters. Hatters manager

Mike Newell was in bullish mood though stating that the team had not become a bad



one overnight and that they would get back to winning ways with the visit of second-placed Bradford City, above.

The Kenilworth Road crowd was slightly down for this top of the table clash but the 7,975 present welcomed back Ahmet Brkovic from suspension and greeted Charlton loan keeper Simon Rovce.

Roger Wash looks back to see how the Town fared on this day in years gone by

Royce became a spectator as the Town went on the attack.

Brkovic scored with a spectacular overhead kick in the 14th minute and there was only going to be one winner.

The second goal, on 32 minutes, came when Steve Howard netted after some lovely Hatters passing.

The game was over as a contest four minutes later when Paul Underwood drilled home number three.

Town squandered several good opportunities after the break but settled for one more goal - stroked home by Brkovic. All was right in the world again!


