

Blast from the past

Roger Wash looks back to see how the Town fared on this day in years gone by

April 9, 2005 Bournemouth 0 Luton Town 1

THE Town had enjoyed a remarkable 2004-05 campaign and by April could see the finishing post in their quest to return to the Championship (old Division Two) for the first time since 1996.

With five games to go over 1,600 Luton supporters travelled to Bournemouth to swell the crowd to a record 9,058 at the revamped and renamed Fitness First Stadium.

They saw the Town the quickest out of the blocks with Ahmet Brkovic firing a volley just over from the edge of the box in the fifth minute, and Rowan Vine somehow shooting



wide with just home goalkeeper Neil Moss to beat six minutes later after Steve Howard had robbed Cherries' midfielder Marcus Browning.

Bournemouth came more into the game with John Spicer seeing his shot superbly tipped aside by Marlon Beresford and Wade Elliott having an effort cleared off the line by Russ Perrett as the tide seemed to be turning.

And the momentum

went further with the Cherries a minute later after Perrett was sent off for a clumsy challenge on James Hayter as the striker ran clean through.

Luton immediately brought on Chris Covne to partner Curtis Davies in the heart of the Town defence and the pair held firm as the Cherries failed to make their numerical advantage count.

Sensing that Bournemouth were running

out of ideas, Luton manager Mike Newell threw on Enoch Showunmi with 15 minutes to go with the instruction to go out and win the game.

Following the instruction to the letter the giant Nigerian international was handily placed in the area to deflect the ball into the net off the bar after a Kevin Nicholls corner was touched on by Howard.

The goal came with six minutes to go and the Town managed to hang on comfortably and cue ecstasy amongst the players and massed ranks of Luton supporters who knew that promotion was theirs all bar the shouting.




