GOING UP: Hatters have a fighting chance of promotion

I CAN pinpoint the exact moment that I realised we were going to be in the Conference/BSP for the long haul.

It was as I raised my hands to my face so that I wouldn't have to watch too closely as Kevin Nicholls was sent off, as he had just set off at a considerable rate of knots with the express intention of cutting an Oxford player in two.

We were playing Oxford at their place and at that point if I remember correctly we were both unbeaten.

After that defeat it had become obvious that not only Mick Harford, but most of the players as well, were beginning to understand that it wasn't going to be a matter of just turning up and beating everybody week-in, week-out.

The attitude was all wrong that first season. We were going to be, in the words of one of the players who shall remain nameless, 'the Manchester United of the division'. Fair enough.

In terms of support we were. But we overlooked one thing, United thrive on being the Manchester United of the Premier League and are almost never beaten at home.

We attracted the big crowds who watched in horror as the 'little' teams turned up and treated it as their Cup final, and all too often went away with one or three points.

Last season the precise moment I realised that we were again doomed not to win the title was when Richard Money surrendered to Crawley.

Firstly by calling us underdogs; secondly by being intimidated by their manager after the game.

Two play-off defeats, the most recent one still so raw that although I hold no grudge against them. I can barely bring myself to read about AFC in the Football League where we should be.

And now, I have to warn you that according to my odds compilers at William Hill we are odds-on to be defeated again in the play-offs - a 10/11 shot for that to happen.

To go up via the play-offs is a 3/1 chance and to go up in triumph by winning the Conference - well that is a 7/2 chance.

Once again the fates are already conspiring against us and our opening game is postponed, putting us one step behind everyone else (apart from Telford) already.

But the advantages this season are that there appears to be no Stevenage or Crawley to trip us up. that our players must now have truly come to terms with where we are and what it takes to get ourselves up, and that the rest of the division and the media appear to have convinced themselves that we are a spent force.



Still if we don't do it, there's always the consolation prize of the play-offs... third time lucky anyone?









SO, here we go again! Third time around at places like Forest Green and Tamworth. Third different manager. Third time lucky?

Gone is Mick Harford's phoenix from the flames project, and Richard Money's defend at all costs approach has failed too.

As for Brabin? Well, but for a lick of paint, he would have succeeded already and like Jason Walker and many others, I did think it was in too.

But with a full preseason, what appears



to be the 'Brabin Way'?

As of right now. it does seem that it will be one that is flexible. We have seen 4-4-2 and 4-3-3 in pre-season and both have been effective at times.

What we do have though, is a crosso-

ver where our widemen. James Dance. Robbie Willmott and Aaron O'Connor seem more suited to being part of a front three whereas MBH, AMS and Danny Crow work better in a strike partnership than as the central striker in a trio.

Looking outwards from Kenilworth Road, the landscape of our position in the division is changing.

In year one, we were the big fish expected to run through the division, whereas last vear it was all about whether Luton could keep up with the Crawley spending powerhouse.

Now, while we are still the team everyone wants to beat. we are considered no more than one of a pile of favourites that include Fleetwood and York.



Blast from the past

Roger Wash looks back to see how the Town fared on this day in years gone by

August 20, 1966 Luton Town 2 Halifax Town 0

AFTER narrowly failing to win promotion from the old Division Four at the end of the 1965-66 season, all Luton supporters knew that the new campaign was likely to be one of struggle.

The reason for this was obvious – the complete dismantling of what was a decent side.

Out went top goalscorer John O'Rourke, talismanic centrehalf Matt Woods, combative midfielder John Reid and goalkeeper Colin Tinsley.

In their places came some cast-offs with the rest of the depleted squad made up with untried youngsters.

It was therefore a much changed side that kicked off the new season at a hot Kenil-

worth Road against Halifax in front of a crowd of 6,149 who were still basking in the glory of England's World Cup winning performance over West Germany only three weeks before.

The 'Green Un' reporter remarked that many spectators were in 'shirt sleeves and summer dresses!'

Luton manager George Mar-

tin had decided to opt for the newly fashionable 4-3-3 system but his players struggled to impose themselves in the first half.

All this changed after the break though with new signing Gerry King netting in the opening minute.

The lead was doubled two minutes later when King, who had helped Torquay to promotion the previous season, nodded a David Pleat centre down to 18-year-old Bruce Rioch who made no mistake from close range to secure the two points.

Sadly, it did not get any better than this as the predictable slump arrived pretty soon afterwards and it took a change of manager and a couple of astute signings before fears of re-election could finally be banished.
