

Blast from the past

Roger Wash looks back to see how the Town fared on this day in years gone by

Luton Town 1 Wolves 1 September 10, 2005

THE Town decided to use this game as a celebration to mark the 100th anniversary of football at Kenilworth Road.

Great efforts were made to bring back many past players who were paraded before the start of the match in a carnival atmosphere despite the rain.

It was appropriate that Wolves were the guests to our party as they had broken the league attendance record at Kenilworth Road back in 1955, during the Hatters' firstever season in the top

flight. Everyone was hoping for a repeat of that 5-1 scoreline!

The Hatters had started off their first season in the Championship (the old Division Two) in brilliant form and were up to third spot, three places ahead of Wolves. Despite a bright start by the Town it was Wolves who opened the scoring on 25 minutes when Mark Kennedy sent over a brilliant cross which was slid home by Carl Cort at the far post.

The Hatters roared back on the wet surface and saw an effort from Chris Coyne cleared off the line before Steve Robinson headed an Ahmet Brkovic cross against the bar.

The second half continued in the same vein with Wolves content to soak up Luton pressure but we had to wait until 10 minutes from time for the

deserved equaliser.

Carlos Edwards, in for the injured Kevin Foley at right back, went on a marauding run down the wing before squaring a delightful ball to skipper Kevin Nicholls who curled home an unstoppable shot.

At the end of the game Wolves manager Glenn Hoddle looked on the draw as a point gained while Luton boss Mike Newell, who had been sent to the stands at the interval for 'kicking the ball at referee Lee Probert in an aggressive manner', thought that the Town were the stronger side and deserved to win.




