BACK in the day I used to work in betting shops. Televisions were not permitted in the shops from the time they were legalised in 1961 until 1986. I was working in them in the early 70s.

I rose through the ranks quickly, having started as the chap responsible for writing the names of the runners and riders and results on the shop's chalkboards initially, then as technology improved, on whiteboards with marker

Instead of being able to watch all the races on large screen TVs as you can today, we had to listen to them relayed to us over a tinny tannoy link which started at the racecourse concerned from where the race commentary was sent to a central point, from which it was then broadcast to all the shops in the country.

Invariably, almost every race appeared from the commentary to produce a thrilling finish, with several horses neck-andneck as they charged for the line at the business end of the race with the commentator getting frantically excited as he related the outcome to the transfixed punters, desperate to discover whether their selection had won or lost. Bear with me, this does have a Luton relevance!

Anyway, having heard these commentaries during the day it was always very instructive to read the next day's Sporting Life in which was contained reports on all the races - which almost never bore any similarity to what we'd been told was going on.

A certain poetic licence had been taken with the action in order to spice up the commentaries for the listeners.

Which brings me to the delights of listening to the live commentary of a match rather than being at the game.

I listened to the commentaries of a few away games recently and although the lads do an excellent job of bringing the drama and excitement to the listener, by their own admission they are often positioned with a worse view of the action than the fans themselves, thus making it all the more difficult for them to identify players and key incidents.

In the 'old days' this was no big deal - as long as they didn't get the score wrong, no-one was going to complain even if they got the occasional scorer or booked player wrong.

But that was before Youtube - where it is now possible to see for yourself what has happened.

A couple of Amari Morgan-Smith's goals have seemed to be difficult to describe in recent games and I have to say that my impression of them from the

radio descriptions has not been remotely borne out by the actual experience of watching them unfold in front of me.

However, the Justin Dealeys, Euan Duncans, Simon Oxleys (not forgetting the late Pearcey) etc of this world deserve only the highest praise from all of us for the job they do.

They have to interview managers who would rather be anywhere other than in front of the microphone - I should imagine Richard Money was not easy at all in that respect - and who wanted to be the man accusing Mick Harford of having made a tactical cock-up!

After the Bath game, Gary Brabin was clearly on the verge of exploding with frustration. Yet he had to be interviewed without the interviewer putting his own self-preservation instincts first.

If you doubt just how many minefields and booby-traps your commentators have to negotiate, just call up a Luton game on Youtube and turn the sound right down before trying to put your own commentary to the images.

Even with the benefit of hindsight. you'll still find you're not quite sure whether that was Willmott or Lawless - let alone what the name of the opposing centre-half is.

We take those chaps for granted - but fortunately for us they don't do the same to us. And if you really want to be wound up while a game is going on - find the local BBC station which covers whoever the Town are playing and listen to their commentary of the game.

Let's hope the boys get an easy ride this afternoon with only a string of Town goals to talk about and an interview afterwards that is all sweetness and light. But I wouldn't bet on it...



AFTER finishing the 1976-77 campaign in sixth spot in Division Two (now the Championship) and only four points off promotion, much was expected of the players the following season.

That they got off to a fairly sluggish start was not helped by three players, Ron Futcher, Paul Price and Alan West back late from playing over the summer in the USA and missing pre-season training as well as the opening day game against Orient at Kenilworth Road.

By the time of the second home game the wanderers had returned and, fully integrated back into the side, helped produce the biggest win for 20 years with Charlton being hammered 7-1.

Jim Husband bagged four that afternoon, the first Luton

Magpies out of sight. On 52 minutes Lil Fuccillo smashed the ball home after a simple move down the middle engineered by Paul Futcher, his twin brother Ron and West.

Two minutes later summer signing Phil Boersma took advantage of a hesitant Notts defence and stroked the ball home.

All was now right in our world and when the Town then went on a four-game unbeaten run pushing them up to second, promotion was back on the agenda!

Unfortunately it was a truly awful game that we managed to lose with a howler of a goal but the offshoot of that meant the commentators moved on to other things to talk about.


