I SEE that El Hadji-Diouf has signed for Doncaster. Some strange situation going on there by which big name players currently out of contract and/or without a club, will put themselves in the public domain while playing on a short-term basis for Dean Saunders.

I wonder what Donny fans will feel about that? Will they be pleased to see big names like him in their club colours, or rather object to being used in this way?

It got me wondering about what it has been like to see unexpected players popping up in Hatters' colours from time to time.

The closest equivalent for us to the Diouf arrival (betting without the enigmatic Lars Elstrup, of course) would, in my opinion, be when we signed Kerry Dixon.

It never felt right to see him in a Town shirt and for sure I have always felt that when he played for us in the semi-final against Chelsea. not only their fans but also the player himself, felt he really should have been playing for them!

I don't think anyone can think other than that Janos Kovacs (whether we are supposed to call him Ko-varch, or Ko-vax!) has been fully committed in his time with us on loan from Hereford - and I'm sure Southport fans in turn have been delighted by what Godfrey Poku and Dan Walker have done for them!

The loanees I most enjoyed seeing at Kenilworth Road were the remarkable Rory Allen, a good few seasons ago now, who almost singlehandedly turned the Town's season around through exuberance and sheer force of will - which he later exercised by walking away from his career if I remember correctly.

Then there was Gary McSheffrey. What an impact that human dynamo created in his time with the club. It seems to me he never really fulfilled the exciting potential he was exhibiting when he was with us when he went on to ply his trade with other clubs on a full-time basis.

The player with the single greatest impact on a Luton side, though, was not a loanee - although his arrival was certainly unexpected.

I had no idea who he was and what he was doing on the Kenilworth Road pitch when we kicked

off against Torquay.

Within seconds he had instantly controlled a mishit pass, as though it were the easiest skill in the world. and as he then rolled out the most spectacular debut any Town player can ever have enjoyed I stared openmouthed at the spectacle of a man with the silkiest of skills imaginable, who quite clearly could have graced a rather more elevated stage than the one we could ever offer him. He remains the greatest player I have witnessed in our shirt. Yes, I saw Mick H, Ricky H, John H, Scott O. etc. etc - but none of them had the natural flair of JLV.

And it may be over-egging the pudding and tempting fate, but the closest equivalent to JLV's impact in recent seasons has been the excitement and anticipation which follows JPK on to the pitch - I only hope he ends up making half the impact of JLV. If he does, then we're going up... if not, well maybe his lookalike, Lionel Messi, fancies a short-term break from his current employers by taking a sabbatical in Bedfordshire...



Tom's take



Tom Skinner gives his thoughts on the latest Hatters news

LUTON'S erratic results make penning this column very difficult.

I generally make sure I don't write in the immediate aftermath of a game, when the excitement/ frustration is coursing through my veins. I think I made this mistake after the Lincoln game though, where I confidently talked up Luton's chances of success, only for my optimism to drain away when our bubble burst at Bath.

It shows how postmatch interviews can't be easy, which is perhaps why managers trot out clichés like 'leagues aren't won and lost in October', as they don't want to say something they'll regret. (Incidentally, when do leagues start being won and lost?)

I suppose the banal questions that the media sometimes ask are hardly likely to elicit very original responses.

So, looking at the big picture, where do we stand?

Remarkably, after 18 games, we have exactly the same amount of points and goal difference as we did at this stage last season. While I don't think there's going to be a juggernaut like Crawley to compete with this year, incon-

sistency, which was our Achilles heel last year, is still holding us back. Inconsistency which ultimately cost Richard Money his job.


Brabs has acknowledged we need to be braver, which is absolutely right. The quality of some of

the goals we scored against Barrow and Gateshead shows what talent we've got in the squad, and when we're struggling to break teams down, it's vital that we have the likes of Watkins and Kissock on the pitch to find that killer pass.

The debate about Luton fans not giving the players enough encouragement rumbles on. There's no excuse for booing the team or individuals, but the apparent elusiveness of top spot is deeply frustrating.

Keep the faith and get behind the lads, because when we finally get promoted, it will be all the sweeter.



If Half-time Orange's Steve Nolan was i charge of the team, this is what he'd do.

IT seems a long time since the last home BSBP game (it's only been a couple of weeks), but I'm still reeling a little bit from that Wrexham defeat.

If I'm honest I haven't brought myself to watch Town since, what a spineless whimper of a performance that was against the league leaders.

It's a bit worrying that we've been awful against the two best teams we've faced to date so far (York being the other side).

But unlike previous years it's lucky that no-one's running away with it and a good win today against high-flying Fleetwood with results going our way and we're right back in the mix again.

There seems a relative embarrassment of riches at the back compared to earlier in the season with the likes of Pilkington and Blackett available for selection.

I'm not a massive fan of Osano, so think I'd sit Keane at right back with Kovacs and Pilks in the middle with Howells on the left.



From beyond these shores

Roger Wash goes globetrotting to feature players born across the world who found their way to Hatters

Born in Australia: Chris Coyne

BRISBANE-born Chris Covne came to these shores in 1996 following a £150,000 transfer from Perth SC to West Ham.

Frustratingly. the tough tackling centre-half could only manage one substitute first team appearance for the Hammers although he was part of the Hammers youth team that reached the FA Youth Cup final in 1996.

After loan spells at Brentford and Southend he joined Dundee



on a free transfer in 2000.

Seeking a commanding centre-half to help secure the Luton Town back line as they attempted to win promotion from

Division Three in 2001. manager Joe Kinnear paid £50,000 to bring Coyne to Kenilworth Road and rarely was that sum of money better spent.

Forming part of the spine of the side that included Kevin Nicholls and Steve Howard, Coyne helped the Hatters to promotion in his first season and again in 2004-05 when the championship of League One was won in glorious style.

Covne was named in the PFA League One Team of the Season as a further reward for

his efforts.

With the Town entering into administration in 2007, Coyne was seen as a saleable asset and the reluctant centre-half was sold to Colchester for £350,000 which was a record fee for the Essex club.

After 18 months at Colchester, Coyne returned to Australia to sign a three-year deal with Perth Glory.

In doing so Coyne hoped to be in full view of the international side selectors. to add to his seven full caps and earn a place in the squad for the World Cup in 2010.


