# MANOR Odds on Sharpe, Media Relations Director,



I APOLOGISE for writing an article with effectively no Luton Town content, but the deadline day for penning this piece coincided with the tragic death of Gary Speed which rather overshadowed every Hatters-related thought I'd had in mind to pass on to you.

A few years ago I wrote the biography of a man I had known for 30-plus years, the eccentric. flamboyant rock 'n' roll singer and mayerick wannabe politician and founder of the Official Monster Raving Loony Party, Screaming Lord Sutch.

A man seldom out of the media limelight, always ready with a laugh and a joke when interviewed, killed himself by hanging.

I'd been with him just two days earlier. I had seen no indication of what was to come.

Of course, I asked myself what, if anything, I could possibly have done to prevent him doing what he did, but had to admit that the real answer was, sadly, 'nothing at all'.

I interviewed scores of people while I was writing the book.

Everyone who had been a friend of Sutch, and thought they knew him well, professed themselves shocked and astonished.

Those who had been Sutch's loved ones and lived with him were nowhere near as surprised.

They had suspected, sometimes known, of the demons which haunted him, the black clouds of depression which enveloped him when he was on his own.

They had rightly feared the sad end which finally came to pass.

I didn't know Gary Speed. The only thing we shared was a set of initials.

Yet his death affected me for most of the next day and into the

Coincidentally, that next day I was at the presentation for an award I instigated almost a quarter of a century ago, the William Hill Sports Book Of The Year.

The winner of the award was a book by German writer, Ronald

Reng, 'A Life Too Short'.

A book about the suicide of German national goalkeeper, Robert Enke. It is a magnificent, moving work. But it cannot answer the question 'Why?'

Also, over the same weekend the horseracing world was mourning a stable lad whose suicide was reported in the Racing Post.

A week or so before former top cricketer Peter Roebuck took his own life.

It is not, of course, a tragedy peculiar to sport. Depression affects people in all walks of life.

But are sportspeople and those in the public eye perhaps in some way drawn to the ultimate grand gesture, influenced by the language of sport in which a missed kick, a fluffed serve, a botched putt, are reported as tragedies.

When a dropped point, a bungled substitution can be described as 'suicidal errors'.

These ultimately transient, insignificant errors and mistakes are fundamentally trivial.

The death of a human being by his own hand, that's tragic.

Gary Speed, RIP







Without him, they are now third... THIRD!



Raddy Antic. Yugoslavia:

When Raddy Antic joined the Hatters in the summer of 1980, the first of manager David Pleat's forays into the foreign transfer market, he instantly brought to Kenilworth Road an accumulated international experience unmatched by any of his colleagues.

Antic had played in his native Yugoslavia for Partizan Belgrade, in Turkey for Fenerbahce and in Spain for Zaragoza, picking up five Yugoslav caps along the way.

A sweeper in the truest sense of the word, Antic had exceptional technical skills and passing ability as well as a powerful shot.

Unfortunately, Pleat rarely played a sweeper system so Antic had to fight for his place in midfield where the Hatters had an abundance of riches at the time.

He therefore spent most of his time

at Kenilworth Road on the bench, where his experience and versatility could be used most effectively as substitute.

It was on one of these substitute appearances that he earned permanent hero status with Luton fans.

In May 1983, the Town travelled to Manchester City for a relegation dogfight.

Luton needed to win to stay up while City only required one point.

With only five minutes left the game remained scoreless but then up popped recently introduced sub Antic to volley home what proved to be the only goal.

Antic retired from playing 12 months later but will always be remembered as the man who made it possible for David Pleat to set off on his famous jig across the Maine Road nitch!


