Season two began with the warning that Crawley would be making a big spending bid to land the division.

We chuntered along hoping that something, anything, would turn up in the shape of a run of form. We finally plucked up the courage to discard a manager who was clearly the wrong man for the job.

With the pressure of chasing Crawley off, we finally put together a run of form under the new boss. We charged past Wrexham in the play-off semis - but in the final we wimped out big time.

Not the first time we'd done it, not the first time our manager had presided over such a flop. Nonetheless, we permitted him to discard our big money striker and the boss was reappointed with indecent haste, as though no-one on the board had bothered to sit down and seriously contemplate making a change.

This season, lo and behold, Fleetwood are the big money boys. Once again we can't cope with the pressure of living with them.

Not sure how much more money their boss had to spend than us, but he sure has spent it more wisely and well.

Time and time again we've flattered

to deceive. Time and time again we've surrendered leads which should have been straightforwardly defended.

Time and again we've brought in new players, all given a big build up - Samuel, Beckwith, Brunt, Kissock, Hand, Henry, Antwi, Fleetwood, Wright, McAllister. None of them has established himself as a regular in the side.

One or two mistakes in bringing players in is acceptable. That many isn't. And where are the signings who have made an impact in that time? Morgan-Smith, Dance and Taylor for sure - O'Connor, maybe. Kovacs, yes, but we already knew he was good.

But, the crucial proof of our ineptitude must be the fact that as I write we are a dozen points or so behind Fleetwood/Wrexham.

The same Wrexham we saw off comfortably in the play-offs, the same Wrexham who have had all sorts of money problems, have changed manager, who when they came to Kenilworth Road this season took a ruthless, single-minded attitude to the game, didn't give a damn what anyone thought about their tactics of time wasting more blatantly than even Watford, Stevenage or Crawley ever did, as long as they produced the goods.

I'm sure we are better financed than them. We're told we have better players. We're even told we have great team spirit. So why are they up there ahead of us?

We will probably end up playing York and Wrexham in the play-offs again. How much are you prepared to gamble that we'll beat either or both of them this time round?



I'm delighted to hear this is the case, though I'm disappointed that it's taken half of yet another season in this league to realise that no-one's going to give us promotion on a plate.

Graham Westley's recent departure from Stevenage threw speculation on whether their 'glory days' might be nearing their end.

Maybe the memories of Stevenage's gamesmanship – including their famous 'time out' routine – and dirty play have faded a little. But I have to admit, I'm getting to the stage now that I've got to grudgingly admire the progress of a team who at the time of writing are sitting in



the League One playoff places.

Unlike Crawley and Fleetwood, they haven't thrown obscene amounts of money around to achieve their success.

It's been gained by hard work and deter-

mination, epitomised by a demanding 9am-5pm training regime.



From beyond these shores

Roger Wash goes globetrotting to feature players born across the world who found their way to Hatters

ALTHOUGH born in Malta, Wally Shanks was brought up in Scotland and was on the brink of joining Aberdeen when war broke out.

After the war, during which time he formed a great friendship with Tommy Walker the ex-Hearts player, Shanks toyed with offers from both Blackpool and Spurs but decided to follow his old friend, now at Chelsea, to Stamford Bridge.

Unfortunately there were around 70 professionals at Chelsea at the time and seemingly more arriving daily after de-mob and Shanks was always going to have a job getting into the first team.

Joe Payne, the ex-Luton player who was at Chelsea at the time, recommended him

to Luton and so began a happy 14-year career at Kenilworth Road.


Shanks made his debut at Bury on January 18, 1947, and made a further seven appearances that season all on the wing, following on with 10 games in 1947-48 again in the number seven shirt.

The breakthrough eventually came in 1949-50 when 30 appearances were made together with his first league goal - the winner in a 1-0 victory at Preston.

Shanks then remained virtually ever present until 1957 when he joined the Town's coaching staff.

Following relegation in 1960, Shanks left the club in the general shake-up and concentrated on his thriving sports business in Luton with Gordon Turner.

After going on to run the 'Brown Owl' for many years before retiring, Shanks sadly died in November 2010.


