GARY Brabin has at last achieved something no other Luton Town manager has come close to – he has made me quite happy to give up watching a home game and go horse racing instead, despite effectively forfeiting the money I have already paid to watch the game via my season ticket.

I've finally had enough now that we are so far behind Fleetwood that it only remains for us to amass enough points to yet again face the potential crushing disappointment of play-off failure.

Still, I think my wife is happy enough with him. When we went away for a few days to celebrate our anniversary earlier in the year it coincided with the game at Stockport, to which I was listening on 3CR before we went down for dinner. We were a goal up and cruising, so off we trotted to the restaurant.

After a pleasant repast I quickly nipped upstairs to check on the score, being thrown into an unholy rage to hear us give up the lead by conceding a late goal – a phenomenon which has become a regular part of our season.

When I returned to the table I could barely speak for frustration and anger, and our anniversary almost turned into a divorce dinner.

But when we recently enjoyed another short sojourn, I was so sure that we were going to disgrace ourselves again that I made a point of booking dinner BEFORE the game at Barrow kicked off and didn't bother to check the score at all, safe in the knowledge that we would again take the lead only to blow it.

You'll have gathered that I am well and truly in the anti-GB camp, and as a result I take some regular Twitter stick from people who say, in essence, 'Leave Brabs alone, give him time, he's doing okay, look where we are in the league and how well we're doing in the Trophy.' To which I respond, 'You or I could get us where we are in the League and Trophy.'

Problem is, we are virtually guaranteed a play-off place and the law of averages could just conspire to ensure that at long last Mr B actually manages to win one of the damned things. That would then put us in the Football League but with the awful prospect of a season of struggle before GB is properly found out.



trip to Wembley for the FA Tro-phy final would be a lovely day out, I can't help but feel it's still an unwelcome distraction from doing what the boys have failed

to do for the last two seasons - actually finish the job.

Call me a pessimist but I'm not looking forward to the prospect of another outing in the play-offs, mainly because I can't help but feel that this side is, in my opinion, the weakest squad we've had in the Conference so far.

That squad is all the weaker for number two keeper Kevin Pilkington leaving for Notts County, in any other Conference squad he would have

been hands down number one between the sticks, but provided superb cover for Mark Tyler and will be missed.

In front of Tyler in my line-up would be Taylor, who has become an extremely consistent performer at left-back, Pilkington in the centre alongside Kovacs, and Ed Asafu-Adjaye

– who looked brighter in his start
against Gateshead – at rightback.

Elsewhere, Andre Boucaud seems to have made a promising start to life at the Hatters and would take his place alongside Keane and Lawless in a midfield

After a disappointing run of form, Fleetwood seems to be looking a bit more like the player we all hoped we'd signed after his impressive first couple of outings in a Town shirt back in the autumn, and I'd like to see Howells and O'Connor playing off him.

SO, KP has retired and I think it is safe to say the reaction was quite mixed.

Having read an article about the 'other KP' recently though. it struck me how similarly they are viewed right now.

Every little thing Pietersen does wrong right now is pounced upon as a reason he should be dropped despite having the third highest postwar Test average of any England batsman to have played as many matches.

Whereas, Luton fans pounced on every Pilkington



mistake because Tyler was the fans' favourite, when the ability difference was about as miniscule as the dignity anyone wearing a home shirt at Stadium: MK has left.

It is only when Pietersen retires that cricket fans will appreciate how good a batsman he was and

the hole he will leave when he is gone.

The hole that Pilkington leaves will do the same for us Luton fans.

What is left is a 34-year old starting goalkeeper that, despite how good he is, has a back problem that could flare up at any point.

That is when the hole behind him is deeply exposed.

All that is left is Lewis Kidd, who may well develop into a quality keeper, but if he was anywhere near ready, he would have played in Trophy games by now.

So we will need to loan in another keeper.

However, who is going to loan us anyone when they have as little hope of playing while Tyler is fit as they do at their current club?

Mind vou, when Brabin took Cambridge United to the play-off final in 2009, and found himself without his firstteam goalkeeper he managed to bring in the conference's 'goalkeeper of the year' on a one game emergency loan. so he could do that again!





Ahmet Brkovic. Croatia:

The 'Croatian
Sensation' came to
England after meeting
a Romford girl who was
on holiday in Croatia.
The former Dubrovnic
midfielder had trials
at both Millwall and
Luton before accepting
a contract with Leyton
Orient in November
1999.

In East London he starred as the 'O's won through to the 2001 play-off finals, where they lost 2-4 to Blackpool, before signing for the Hatters that summer on a 'Bosman' free transfer.

He then became a regular in the Luton side that climbed from the basement to the Championship and won the fans over with his clever footwork. intelligent use of the ball and occasional spectacular goals from overhead kicks - also not forgetting his stunning header in the final minute of the promotion clash with Hull at Kenilworth Road in 2005!

Brko sadly moved on to Millwall during the 2007/08 campaign and was sorely missed as the Town plummeted through the divisions.
