

I'VE been having an interesting week. And Tuesday was quite a signifi-

cant day in my life as it was an almost incredible FORTY years to the day I had first walked into a William Hill betting shop to start work as the guy who wrote the race runners up on the shop whiteboard (at which point I had been a Luton Town supporter for 13 years and counting).

I've managed to survive in the very hostile, competitive world of bookmaker public relations for almost a third of a century, so I do understand something about the pressures which come with a high-profile position.

One of my first tasks each day is to send out some tweets and since the Great Forest Green humiliation I have been pointing out each successive disaster to befall us.

I had lunch on Tuesday with Bruce Millington, editor of the Racing Post, and a Crystal Palace fan, who asked me "Why can't your mob get out of the Conference?"

That evening, of course, I realised we had slipped out of the play-off positions as York won at Bath.

I had been at the Grimsby game and wondered yet again at our propensity for failing to hold on to a lead, failing to kill off teams, failing to make logical substitutions, failure to play specialist players in their specialist positions, failure to drop anyone with any remote connection to Cambridge United, and why Gary Brabin decided it would be a good idea to walk over to applaud the home fans after the game.

Especially when all of those fans had recently read the coruscating criticism of said manager in that day's programme, yet seen precious little in the previous couple of hours to suggest it was unwarranted.

If my boss had written that about me I would have felt I had no option whatsoever but to resign. And if I had followed up that criticism with yet another failure to produce the goods he would undoubtedly have kicked my rear end out of the building.

I do not hold any personal grudge against Gary Brabin. I have never met him. I understand he may suffer short-term financial hardship were he to lose his job. But that risk comes with the territory. Every football manager knows that only too well.

I can't believe that if Gary fails

- for the fourth time - to beat York on Friday night, that his own pride could allow him to stay in his job.

The players do not seem to have been 'playing for' him, which is a disgrace in itself, but it happened at Chelsea just before AVB got the chop, and it didn't do them much harm to change personnel. However, getting rid of Mick McCarthy was hardly positive for Wolves, so there are pros and cons to replacing a manager.

We could still fluke a play-off place the arrival of our latest (seventh. eight, ninth?) striking prospect, Andre Gray just might be the catalyst we need - but then he did score on his debut and the rest of the squad still couldn't respond to close it out.

The other thing that happened on Tuesday night was that there was one hell of a bust-up after the game between Bradford and Crawley Town, with players being sent off left, right and centre. It even made the BBC Radio 4 news - with the newsreader commenting that Crawley manager Steve Evans 'played the incident down'.

No, I don't think I would like my club run in the way Mr Evans seems to specialise in running his own.

But it cannot be denied that, as so often in a game in which the opposition has been thoroughly wound up. Mr Evans and his men walked off with all three points.

But do you think we could bear just one season in which we play nasty, yet still achieve escape from this hell-hole of a division? In which we become pretty unpopular yet still end up being promoted? Like we were under BFJ? Yes.



WHILE on the pitch drama has been in short supply this season, things usually get a bit tasty when York City are the opposition.

Going back, there was that infamous game at Bootham Crescent when Steve Howard publicly disobeyed Joe Kinnear's orders not to retake a penalty, promptly missed again and was then substituted in disgrace.

Two games later, Howie bagged his first of the season against Torquay, and never looked back, going on to score over 100 goals for the Town to become a club legend. If only Craig McAllister could undergo a similar transformation. Now Fernando Torres has found the net again surely anything is possible?

Unfortunately, the majority of our recent experiences of York have been painful, with the latest nightmare instalment a last-gasp FA Trophy exit costing the club £250,000.

It was encouraging to see the players' passion – Kovacs whipping up the crowd, Taylor hunched inconsolable at the end – for a trophy of little sporting value.

We need that desire in our remaining

We've fallen well short of the points tally and form that Luton fans rightly expected for this season. The board seem to feel that the situation is not serious enough to warrant making changes.

Yet if the supporters aren't to become disillusioned and apathetic, we need to start seeing more of a bullish refusal to accept mediocrity, to remember that Luton Town still get double, in most cases triple, the gates of any club in this league and that we must get a better return on this income.

Every game is huge now, so we've got to put our heart and soul into urging the team on – the promised land may seem far away, but where there's a will, there's a way.

I'M writing this month's column the day after the FA Trophy semi-final.

I've been very disappointed, and to be honest, disgusted to read late last night on Twitter, certain fans had been criticising and abusing the players.

One thing that has to be said is that the team had put in a great performance. Despite a very questionable substitution made by the manager in the second half (i.e. why didn't Adam Watkins start the game, and why take off a striker to

recent weeks, and if we do get promoted so much credit must go to our 'number one'.

Tonight, though, it's time to stand up, to step up, and put it all on the line.

Rather like in the business I work in. when the lights are bright, and it's time to perform you may be nervous beforehand, but when vou're out there. there's no better feeling in the world.

So let's get behind the players, and show them we appreciate them!



CAN we beat York and end their recent hoodoo over the mighty Hatters?

I'm going to stick my neck out and say 'yes', but it's going to be another incredibly tight game – almost as tight as 2020 when we clearly should have paid a little bit extra to bag goal machine Jon Shaw from Gateshead earlier this year.

As for the line-up, the easiest decisions are Tyler in goal and the centre-half pairing of Koyacs and Pilks.

Assuming Greg Taylor is fit he'll slot in at left-back allowing Jake to push on from left midfield.

Right-back, well that's a tricky one, but it goes to Curtis Osano by virtue of being the last man standing.

Bontcho Lubomisov Guentchev

BORN in General Toshevo, Bulgaria, in July 1964, Bontcho Guentchev made his way up through the Bulgarian leagues before, at the age of 27, he signed for Sporting Lisbon in Portugal where he made little impact.

Bontcho then signed for Ipswich for £250,000 to a great fanfare in 1992 and became a cult hero at Portman Road, due to his heroics in helping Bulgaria through to the 1994 World Cup semi-finals, but he often flattered to deceive in the blood and thunder of English football.

Moving to Terry Westley's Luton in 1995 he played in a side doomed to relegation and was often asked to turn out up front when his best position was out wide.

He failed to make an impact in Division Two and was handed a free transfer in 1997.

He then went back to his home country, signing for CSKA Sofia where he netted an amazing 20 times in only 32 league games before returning to England to play for Hendon!

After moving around the London non-league circuit, Bontcho became a coach at Hendon as well as opening a short-lived café in Kensington called Strikers.


