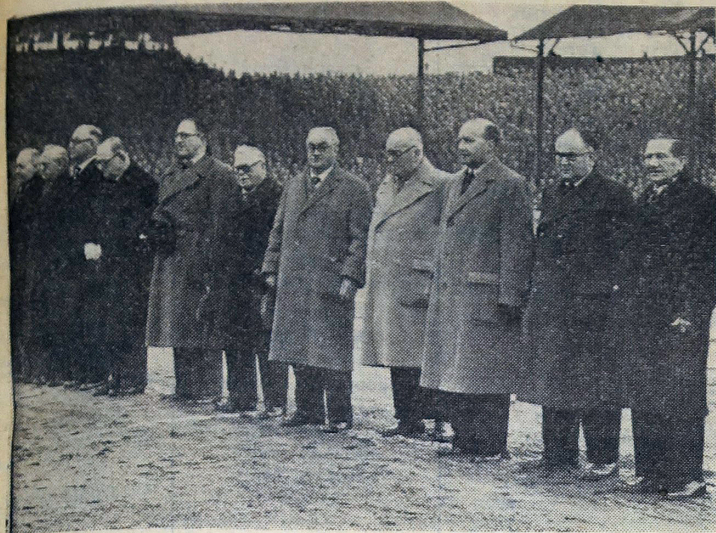


Luton's "Marathon" With Brentford

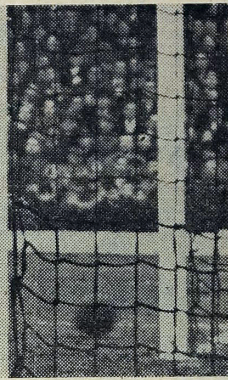

One of those "Phe-e-w!" moments for Brentford supporters. Taylor shoots, and the ball flashes past the post. R3702G.

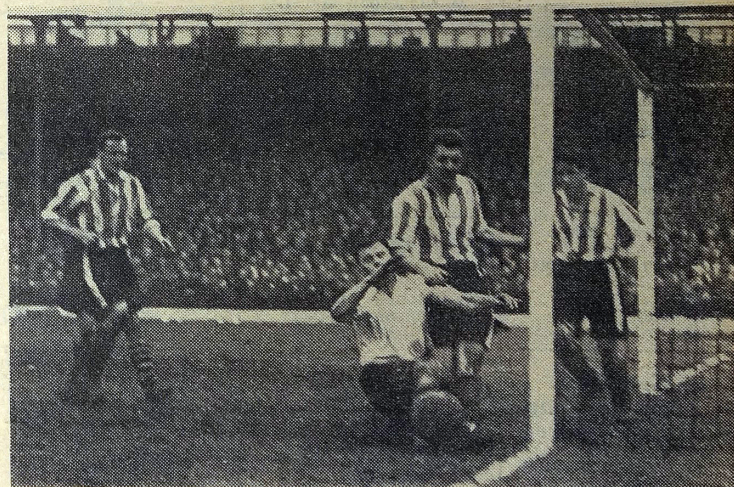


Sturdy Brentford defender was Hill, here seen getting his head to it from Turner's centre, and with Davies in close attendance. R3395G

A good effort by Davies to head through from a corner by Turner, but once more the tight-packed Brentford defence averts danger. R3704G



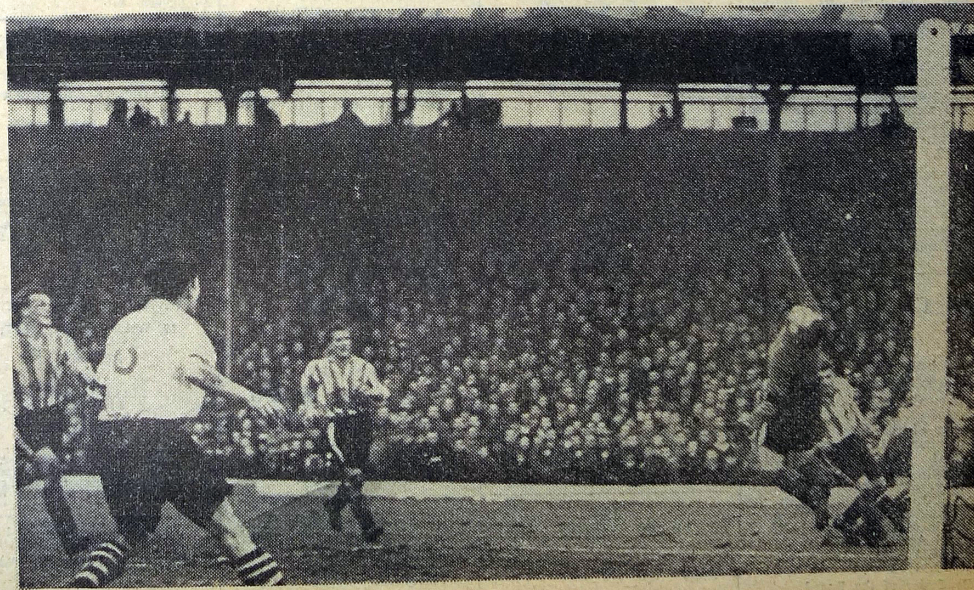
FOILED!
