This claim was made by 'businessman' David Rolls, who says he has 'inside knowledge'. It also revealed that Mr Rolls, a "lifetime Luton Town supporter" intends to buy the club from David Kohler and is prepared to put in £450,000 of his own money. His accountants stated that he could not buy the club on his own, and that the proposal is in the infancy stage. The day after the report was published David Kohler said, on Three Counties Radio, that the report was "pure fabrication". Two weeks later the same newspaper revealed that the man was an imposter, and the whole story had been a hoax.

Paul Mclaren missed the matches against Oldham and Brentford after totting up 5 bookings since November. Mitchell Thomas misses the matches against Bournemouth and Wrexham for similar reasons.

To date, the Hatters have used no less than 30 players in League matches this season, and 25 in cup games. Of these 20 have received red or yellow cards.

Tony Thorpe has been the subject of transfer speculation, with Bristol City making a bid that was described as "not worthy of consideration". The goal Thorpe scored against Fulham was his 50th for the club, taking him past Malcolm MacDonald's figure for the club.

Ian Feuer was dropped ahead of the AWS tie at Fulham, following a lack of form. This is the first time he has been dropped since joining the club.

New Stadium

David Oldfield has joined Stoke City under the Bosman ruling and has signed a three year contract. It seems that Northampton Town were unable to match the wages which Oldfield was receiving at Luton.

Gavin McGowan has become Luton's first summer signing, joining on a free transfer from Arsenal. McGowan has already had two spells on loan at Kenilworth Road.

Kelvin Davis has signed a new 3-year contract which will keep the 21 year-old at Keniiworth Road until 2001. Meanwhile, Paul McLaren, Liam George and Alan White have committed themselves to the club for a further two years, and Matthew Spring for a further three years. Sean Evers and Stuart Douglas are already under contract.

Dwight Marshall has signed a three month contract, and Andrew Fotiadis has signed a one-year deal.

Darren Patterson has signed a 3-year contract with Dundee United after they improved the terms they were offering.

After no club showed any interest in signing him, it looks like Simon Davies will be staying with the Hatters.

Lennie Lawrence has admitted talking to Scottish striker Ally McCoist, who is available on a free transfer from Rangers, but admits that a deal is highly unlikely.

Triallists

Herve Bactuet is an ex-Monaco (reserves) striker aged 22, and is joined by former clubmate Robert Camara, and fellow countryman Frederick Griumard, a midfielder from Troyes. Also at the club has been ex-Feyenoord reserve Michael van Meerlin, and ex-Dundee United midfielder Ray McKinnon. In addition, Lithuanian defender Andrius Teresilinas played an ill-fated 19 minutes against Arsenal before limping off with a groin strain. There have undoubtedly been other foreign players at the club recently, and more (from Portugal and Iceland for instance) will be joining, if only very briefly.

Injuries

Phil Gray and Marvin Johnson are now back in action, but Paul Showler has suffered a recurrence of a knee injury and is undergoing further treatment.

Other News

The Football League Cup has been renamed the Worthington Cup under a new sponsorship deal after Coca Cola's 6 year deal ended. Perhaps the change of name will herald a change of luck for the Town in the competition!

Mitchell Thomas has joined the coaching staff, being appointed player-coach. His role has been described as 85% player and 15% coach until he hangs up his boots. John Moore will now be coaching the reserve team, and assisting with the first team on match days, whilst Paul Lowe is the new youth team coach. Dean Rastrick replaces Lowe as Youth Development Officer. A further full time coach is to be appointed, along with a fitness trainer.

The Town players returned to training on Monday July 6th.

Rory Allen, the star of the Town side at the end of last season has declared that he wants to stay at Spurs. He has three years remaining on his contract, and says that he wants to be a success at the North London club, although he enjoyed his time at Luton.

At the end of June, season ticket sales at Kenilworth Road had reached 2,500, which is on a par with the previous year.

The away Easter fixture with Oldham has been switched to Good Friday, April 2, with a 3.30 kick-off.

Town transfer target Gerry Harrison, the former Burnley midfielder has joined Sunderland on a free transfer.

Trevor Hartley has rejoined Luton Town's coaching staff in what is described as a roving role. He left 12 years ago to join David Pleat at Spurs, and has since coached the Malaysian national side, amongst others.

Luton have jumped into the modern age by appointing Mandy Malins as their first full time fitness trainer. She previously worked at Dunstable Leisure Centre. Part of her brief is to improve the players resistance to injury. It is rumoured that Paul Showler is to be her first customer.

Liam George and Gary Doherty were included in the Republic of Ireland squad which won UEFA under-18 Championship in Cyprus. Doherty played in two matches, whilst George scored the decisive spot kick in the final's penalty shoot-out victory over Germany.
