

## Rob was the player Luton sold for who sealed our fate a cool £21/2 m

NEW signing Rob Matthews made a bright start to his Luton Town career, with an influential role in the Hatters' second-half performance to secure

second-half performance to secure victory over Port Vale.

Matthews had made his debut for the Hatters, also as a substitute, in the previous Saturday's draw with Millwall, and played his first full game in the defeat at Southend. The 24-year-old signed from Notts County for £80,000, as new County boss Howard Kendall reshuffled the pack in a bid to escape relegation.

Although transfer-listed. Rob admitted the Milrough transfer-listed, Hob admitted the move had come as a surprise, but is looking forward to a fresh start.

"I came back from injury last season and struggled a bit for fitness, but felt much better at the start of the current campaign,"

"But with the various changes of management I didn't get a good run of games together."

### Substitute

He appeared as a second-half substitute when the Hatters visited Meadow Lane on New Year's Eve, but of course his most famous, or perhaps infamous, match against Luton was in May 1992 when his two goals sent David Pleat's side down on the final day of the season.

"It was a good day for me on my first full start for County," recalled Rob, "and I was playing for a contract so I couldn't have asked for much more on the day."

He was then 21, so it was a comparatively late start in the professional game after studying for a Geography degree at Loughborough University, during which time he represented the British Universities.

"Nothing really happened when I was at

"Nothing really happened when I was at school regarding clubs coming in for me, so I decided to go to university," said Rob. "After all, when that was finished I was still

on."

He certainly has no regrets about turning professional, and after that two-goal start,took his career record to 13 goals in 40 games for County, including four in seven matches for Kendall.

His departure prompted several angry letters to the Nottingham papers.

David Pleat is happy with his new signing, however, and says Rob has "all sorts of potential."

Mr Pleat added: "When he receives the ball he really goes at defences, and defenders don't like that. It's up to Rob whether he realises that potential. He was certainly influential against Port Vale, and I am pleased with his introduction."





Luton have always had a canny knack of making handsome profits on players they allow to leave the club. And the most handsome of all club. And the most handsome of all was the £2.5million they obtained from Arsenal for I9-year-old Welsh Under-21 international John Hartson a couple of months ago.

The then Arsenal manager George Graham had offered £1.75m for the striker, for whom Luton had received enquiries from half a dozen Premiership clubs.

clubs.

The Luton boss said, more in hope thar expectation "No, the figure is £2.5m and we're not budging," and the Gunners agreed to meet that fee.

The surprising feature of the deal was that Hartson had made only 36 First team appearances for Luton. He made another 25 as a sub and scored 13 first team goals, six of them this season. Since his move he has won a full cap and is a regular scorer for his his new club.

He is fervently patriotic and was once 'selected' to play for an England Under-21 side, "I told the English selectors that I couldn't play FOR England but that I'd be happy to play AGAINST them" he said.

Town FC fans watching their favourite team was taken - probably around 1907 when the Hatters were members of the Southern League, Division 1. In those far-off days fellow Southern Leaguers included Tottenham, West Ham, Millwall, Crystal Palace, Brentford, Fulham, Bristol Rovers

We can't be certain when this picture of Luton sporting a boater. No wonder the Luton team was known as The Hatters!

> It is difficult to imagine any crowd problems, either. Everyone looks so well-behaved. Perhaps it was a boring game!

> Luton of course, were among the first professional clubs in the country but just after the turn of the century, about the time when this picture was taken, the wage bill for the whole of the season was not much more than £2,000, and this was covered by total gate receipts that hovered in the region of £3,500.

> Times certainly change but no doubt the hard core of loyal fans in those days were no less enthusiastic than their counterparts of the 1990's.

Hatters

director Nigel Terry, quality players have been allowed to leave more often than the fans would like. He quickly adds that the manager and board are just as reluctant to see good players go but have to face the harsh financial facts of football.

not

"I sympathise with the fans when they become exasperated when players are transferred but it has to be done. Their anger is emotional; our reasons for approving departures are hard headed business ones, If we didn't allow it the club wouldn't be here. It's as simple as that."

The money factor would also explain why it is possible that the new location of the stadium may be outside the borough boundary. Nigel Terry emphasises that he shares with his fellow directors a fervent desire to see the Hatters

"That would be the ideal answer but we have got to find a site that will enable us to provide what I call 'state-of-the-art' facilities for spectators. Somewhere with ample car-parking space; somewhere that is easily accessible both to our local and our out-of-town supporters, and somewhere that would provide the right setting for Premiership matches.

The Premiership isn't just a pipe dream, he says. "We've been in the top flight before and though we struggled at times our overall record wasn't at all bad. We have a good, if somewhat inconsistent, team at the moment and we have proved quite recently that we can hold our own with sides from the top. In fact I think we perform more efficiently against the better sides. There would be no reason at all for us to fear playing against the country's very top teams."

Nigel Terry joined the board at the time of the Peter Nelkin/David Kohler take-over of a few years ago. "I was asked by Edward Pearson, then a long-standing member of the board, to join them with a view to keeping an eye on the financial side of things and helping in the ever-present income versus expenditure battle."

He has no regrets about accepting the invitation and is now a key member of a much slimmed-döwn team who contribute their various talents with no thought of financial reward.

"We are all different and sometimes we hold diverse views, but that is important. If we all

same there would be no discussion and we would be blinkered around the table but made we present a genuinely united front, We all share a common cause and that is the success of Luton Town FC.

Born in Hitchin Wheathampstead He is managing director of Fisher Frozen Foods, a company with £100 million-a-year turn-over, and part of the Albert Fisher Group whose annua turn-over is £1.5

After leaving schoo he ventured into the frozen food trade,

subsequently started his own company in Bedford, That, in its turn, was bought out by the Fisher Group and now he runs Fisher Frozen Foods from offices in Hemel Hempstead.

"To lead a large company successfully you have to be able to stand back and consider problems with a cool head. The same applies to a football club.

### Confidence

All in all, despite financial pressures and relocation problems, Nigel Terry looks to the future with confidence. Premiership football in the not-too-distant future and a super stadium on the horizon keep him optimistic

"Even if we can't afford to splash out huge "Even if we can't afford to splash out huge sums on buying players we have a manager with a proven ability to spot the potential in young players and bring them to maturity. We also have our wage structure, which can easily get out of hand, under control. We have a good team on the field, a good team in the boardroom and a good

"Our current need is more people through the turnstiles. Can anyone tell me where so many of our supporters have gone? I know some were frightened off when there was unpleasant rowdyism and I know some still harbour unhappy memories of that Millwall Cup-tie mayhem, but those days are long gone. Nowadays its a family affair at Kenilworth-Rd and there's never any trouble.

"I have to stress the need for a better cash-flow. Bank managers are notoriously unsympathetic towards clubs like ours. Luton Town has been made very much aware of that sad fact in the past. Banks refuse to consider our players as genuine assets. They are only interested in seeing a healthy balance in the black. Apart from our players what other assets are there?"

Nigel Terry has no particular sporting background. "I played the usual games at school but didn't take any of them up seriously. For the last few years, though, I have become very keen on golf and play regularly at Brocket Hall, near Welwyn." "I have to stress the need for a better cash-flow



Football, of course, isn't the only victim of that unpleasant ailment, Politics and big business have been tainted, too. Sadly, it seems to be symptomatic of our times. historians might say to the contrary, daylight—street—mugging—was practically unknown, people still left their back doors unlocked, joyriding hadn't been heard of and drugs were something prescribed by doctors to the very ill. I write these words simply—to—prove—what—an old-fashioned,—died-in-the-wool ridiculous old curmudgeon I am and to finish I would like to present the other side of the coin—the side I want to hear more about.

The majority of players today are a long—way—from—being—in—the millionaire—class. They always do their best to entertain, and win; lead decent, normal home lives and stay firmly on the right side of the law.

They produce a brand of football that—is—analysed far—more—by television—and newspaper—pundits than it was in the days—I've been recalling. It is fast, often exciting and probably more—efficiently executed than in the days—I look back on through—distinctly—rose-tinted spectacles.
