. SEASON 1907-8. .

LTHOUGH the air has been presumably thick with what may be called the "Amateur split," yet the serenity of the football in Bedfordshire has not been ruffled in the slightest degree. Whatever grievances certain clubs may profess to have with the parent body, the control of professional football in conjunction with the amateur element has not been detrimental to our County Association. When it is considered that in all the County there is only one professional club, Luton Town, it will be seen that surely there is no grievance. The management of all species of football has ever been the aim of the Beds. F.A., and whatever contentions may exist elsewhere, there is no pinching boot here. Nor can this be wondered at, when the two sides work so amicably for the best interest of the sport and for its efficient control. This is practically the fourteenth season of the Beds. F.A., and its opening seems to be full of hopefulness and promise. Regarded as an administrative body, it will be conceded that it stands second to none in its desire for the cultivation of the highest and best, and its continued encouragement of every grade of football earns for it the respect and admiration of all concerned. Whilst this state of affairs continues, there is every prospect of some successful work in front of it. It has frequently been the comment of its affiliated clubs that nothing is too difficult for it to undertake, and nothing is too irksome for its officials. The very smallest junior feels that it has equally with the strongest club the force behind it which breeds satisfaction and confidence. Last season the high water mark of membership was reached, for 92 clubs were directly affiliated, and although some of these clubs have succumbed to the bugbear of financial difficulty, their places will speedily be occupied with a fresh element. several Leagues in existence, and it is a well-known fact that the interest in this form of competition is now the backbone of the game everywhere. It was with feelings of regret that at the last Annual Meeting there was a drop in the financial status, but not a serious one, because the Association is holding its own and effecting its work upon one of the smallest annual subscriptions in the country. The continued loyalty of the clubs is regarded as a hopeful sign, and puts heart into those who are again entrusted with the work of administration.

At the Annual Meeting in May, Mr. Frank Ebbs, who has been in some office since the inauguration of the Association, felt compelled to relinquish the Presidency, and has been succeeded by Mr. E. Lyonel Finch, of Bedford. It is a satisfaction to know that Mr. Ebbs was not permitted to drop all connection with the Association, as he was elected a Vice-President, so that practically there is again continuity of officials. On the Executive Committee two new workers were seen, Messrs. C. J. Larkinson (Biggleswade), and H. Bunker (Dunstable), and they were speedily initiated into the work of the Association.

The Association is still in close touch with the Council of the Football Association, Ltd., its representative being the Hon. Sec., Mr. G. Wistow Walker, who thus keeps up-to-date with the various movements of the parent body, and the knowledge thus acquired is utilised for the benefit of the Beds. F.A.

LUTON AND DISTRICT LEAGUE.

To some it may appear strange that the old familiar term "Junior League" is now out of order, for at the Annual Meeting it was decided to extend its scope and usefulness if possible, by dropping the term "Junior" and adopting the new name. It is intended to include other clubs which can hardly be termed junior. Last season there were unfortunately no clubs in the First Division, and so the League had to run in two Divisions -a Second and Third. At present it is to be feared that the intentions of the Luton Leaguers have not borne the fruit which was expected at the Annual Meeting. At any rate the door is open now for the clubs to enter a Competition in the Southern part of the County. F.C. as our premier amateur Club, and judging from their last season's form, they are certainly entitled to that honour. They can claim to be the strongest amateur combination in this locality, or even in Bedfordshire. Last season they won both the Bedfordshire Cup and the Bedford League Championship. The former was annexed after beating Kempston Rovers, 10-1; Arlesey, 3-0, after a draw, 2-2; and Luton Celtic in the Final, 2-1. The Bedford League Championship was won for the second time in succession, without losing a point, and a goal average of 28-6. They were champions of this district in the F.A. Amateur Cup, beating Leighton Town 4-1; Wolverton, 6-0; and Dunstable Rangers, 5-2. A very good show was made in the English Cup, as they were only beaten by one goal to nil in the second round at Irthlingboro by the team which eventually reached the Competition proper.

In all the Club played 25 matches, winning 21, losing 2, and drawing the remaining 2, their goal average being 105 against 31. This is a record of which they may well feel proud, and one which the players will be able to look back upon with pleasure in years to come.

The English, Amateur and Bedfordshire Cups are to be competed for again next year, but they have been excluded from the Bedford League on account of distance from the county town.

With a few good friendlies, the Secretary hopes to make up a good fixture list, and with all the players remaining loyal, another successful time should be in store for them.
