THE Directors of the Luton Town Football Club have met with many discouragements in the course of their work, but never with a more disappointing season than last. Having finished fourth on the Southern League table for two seasons in succession, they went to much expense in engaging new players, and particularly in reorganising the forward line. Unfortunately their "stars" persistently refused to shine, they were ignominiously dismissed from the F.A. Cup Competition by Fulham, did badly in their League matches, and as a consequence there was much loss in gate money. This year it is hoped to do much better. Last season's defence, which was good enough for anything, has been retained practically intact, and there seems reason to believe that the new forwards will be a decided improvement on those whose places they take. Porter. amateurs, who assisted Luton occasionally last season, will in future be more frequently available, and the new players are—Gregory (back), Bradley (half-back), Brown, Stansfield, Haycock, Menzies and Johnson (forwards).

Bedfordshire Football Association.

SEASON 1908-9.

THE present season, which is the fifteenth in the history of the Beds. F.A., opens with possibilities of yet greater extension. This body was inaugurated in February, 1904, with the avowed intention of cementing and developing association football within the confines of the county area. That these inaugural ideas have been fully realised is beyond dispute, for the clubs in membership have risen from 23 in 1904 to 109 at the end of last season. It amply proves that by persistent care and helpfulness to the clubs that a wise course was taken. Some of the initial workers are happily still connected with the working of the Association, which has always boasted of the fact that its officers are "workers." In many associations in the country a long list of honorary members can be displayed, but from its inception this course has been avoided, and so keen interest is shown in its management. Mr. Frank Ebbs was the first Hon. Secretary, who ably fulfilled that office for seven years, until increasing business calls compelled his relinquishment, and since his retirement the secretarial work has been carried on by its present Secretary, Mr. G. Wistow Walker, who, curiously, has also held the office for seven years. The finances of the Association are on a very satisfactory basis, the balance in hand being £70. When it is remembered that the annual subscription is only 2/6, and that the finances are dependent on the final match in the County Cup competition, it will be seen that economy in working is a prominent feature of the administration. Not only is care exercised over financial matters, but the needs of all clubs are specially attended to. In the annual

report the secretary referred to the increasing amount of correspondence which he sends out during the year, at least 1500 communications being despatched on every conceivable football topic. If a player or club secretary is in doubt about any knotty point either in the laws of the game or in football law and administration the secretary's help and advice are sought and on no occasion is that withheld. This perhaps is in no small measure the secret of the expansion of the association and the purpose for which it was started. Although it must not be forgotten that the secretary belongs to the great unpaid and loves the work.

Last May the annual meeting was commenced as a movable institution, for until then Luton had been always favoured in this respect. Bedford was the venue and the increased interest taken in the meeting amply justified the Executive Council in their decision. Thus, by moving about, various centres come more in touch with the work. The absence of a preponderance of rough play is becoming marked and the efforts of clubs to suppress bad language and unsportsmanship are to be commended, not that they are entirely banished from

the playing field.

A move has been made in the close season to commence leagues in the county, and now every part of Bedfordshire can boast of a league. The village clubs round Luton, Leighton, Bedford and Biggleswade are now assisted, and keener competition is sure to be shown.

At the Annual Meeting Mr. E. Lyonel Finch, of Bedford, was re-elected President and Messrs. Frank Ebbs (Luton) and J. Davies (Arlesey) Vice-Presidents. Mr. G. Wistow Walker retains the offices of Hon. Sec. and Treas., and also represents the Association at the Council of the Football Association, Ltd. The Executive Council, which is elected in September, may undergo a slight change this season.


