THOMAS A. QUINN



THE Beds. F.A. can hardly be called a young body now as it has run its successful course through sixteen seasons. It has grown from infancy into the spring of manhood, and none can say that the Association has not justified its existence, as last season no fewer than 131 clubs registered themselves with the County Association. This number, with the addition of 10 Leagues and combinations, easily constitutes a record for Bedfordshire. In the last four seasons the club membership has increased over 60 per cent., and the Leagues, &c., have moved up from one to ten. Truly, wonderful progress. These facts prove what a headway the game has made in our midst and then what a firm hold our winter sport has worked o'er the sport-loving community of our small shire. The officers of the Association have been chiefly responsible for this great measure of success and progress, and none more than the President, Mr. E. Lyonel Finch, of Bedford, and Mr. G. Wistow Walker, who has just retired from the Honorary Secretaryship, and the other officers of the Association who do a tremendous amount of work in their own particular spheres for the benefit of the game must not be forgotten.

Two innovations, which should wield a beneficial influence in our midst, were brought into the workings of the Association last season, viz.:—The institution of a benevolent fund and the entrance of our county into the Southern Counties Championship scheme. The benevolent fund has proved very

beneficial to many injured players, and it is hoped to make the fund still more useful and increase its scope and influence to bigger limits. This will surely accrue when clubs and players realise the mutual advantages and great benefits to be derived from such a fund.

From a financial point of view, the county matches were somewhat of a failure, owing chiefly to the wretched weather which was experienced in both of the home matches. But the quality of the games and the fellow feeling which these county matches cultivate amongst amateur footballers far and away outweigh the disadvantages accruing from any financial loss which may be sustained. The players themselves entered into the spirit of the thing with enthusiasm, and the Committee had no difficulty in getting them to make the little sacrifices which were necessary in running these mid-week games. During the coming season Berks. and Bucks, will be met at Luton, Middlesex at Bedford, Hertford in St. Albans and Oxfordshire (away). These games will give plenty of opportunities for our amateurs to shew their skill.

The Association is losing one of its oldest members in the person of Mr. G. Wistow Walker, who is retiring from the Hon. Secretaryship after nine years' service. He has proved himself an impartial and hardworking Secretary and his absence will be sorely felt. His mantle has fallen upon Mr. Albert E. Ansell, the late Hon. Sec. of the Luton Clarence F.C., who hopes, with the co-operation of the officers and committee, to uphold the high standard attained by his predecessor.

The Luton Clarence F.C.

Last season, well maintained their position as our premier amateur club. Season 1906-7, in which they won both the Bedfordshire Cup and the Bedford League, was recorded as a red-letter season for them and one upon which they could hardly improve. But their work during season 1909-10 far excels anything they have previously put on record. They again won both the Beds. Cup and the Bedford League Championship. Their success in the Cup was remarkable as they won the trophy without losing a goal, their victims being: Diamond Athletic, 8-0; Biggleswade (away), 4-0; and Leighton Town in the final, 5-0. They annexed the Bedford League Championship without losing a match, and finished up with a goal average of 57 against 7 (by the way, this was the third time the team had won the Beds. Cup, and it was also the third occasion that they had annexed the Bedford League Championship). In addition they created a record for Beds. by winning their way into the 2nd Round, Competition Proper of the Amateur Cup after beating Luton Celtic 3-0, Chatteris Engineers (away) 7-0, Hitchin Town 6-3 and Apsley (away) 2-0, they succumbed to the Wanderers at Wycombe by 0-2. They also reached the third round of the English Cup, and were also runners up in the Spartan League. These facts speak for themselves, and the Committee and players may well feel proud of the great success which has attended their work.

Altogether the team played 37 matches, won 29, drew 2 and lost only 6, and had the splendid goal average of 163 goals against 36. Their captain, Fred Lane, scored no fewer than 70 goals himself—truly a wonderful feat—in addition to scoring 6 goals for Beds. in County matches. Nine of the players were selected on various occasions to represent their County last season, and Horace Parsons was honoured by being elected Captain in all the County Championship matches. The Clarence can hardly hope to maintain this standard of success, but for the present they deserve our heartiest congratulations for their really splendid work.

The Bedford League last season threw open its doors to all clubs in the County, with the result that all the strongest clubs joined, and a very interesting competition ensued. The 2nd Coldstream Guards won Division "A" of the Spartan League. In the deciding match at St. Albans, the Guards beat the City team by 1 goal to 0.


LUTON WEDNESDAY LEAGUE.
