



I AST season will stand out very prominently in the history of the Luton Club, for, thanks to economy on the one hand and increased support on the other, the Directors found themselves in the almost unique position of finishing up with a balance to the good. Recognising that the time had come to cut the coat according to the cloth and not to speculate too highly on the prospects of cup-tie gates, the wages bill was kept down to the lowest possible point. Happily events showed that this policy had not been carried out at the expense of efficiency, and up to the middle of October, Luton had the satisfaction of heading the Southern League Table. The early successes naturally had the effect of attracting large attendances at the home matches, and all through the season the crowds were very much bigger than in previous years. The gate receipts, with guarantees and gate shares, realised nearly seven hundred pounds more than the previous year, and a considerable sum was also made by the transfer of Smith and Quinn to Millwall. After meeting all expenses the profit on the season was £821 19s. 11d. This season the Directors are relying for the most part on the players who served them so well last, and though equal financial success can hardly be expected, for the weather last season was exceptionally favourable for the home matches, it is hoped that the Club may have another good time.



SEASON 1911-12. XO.

THE past Season—1910-11—was the seventeenth in the existence of the Beds. Football Association. The Association was formed in the year 1894, the inaugural meeting being held in January of that year in the old Cowper's Arms coffee tavern in Cheapside. The meeting was called by a gentleman whose name was at that time a synonym in local football circles, viz.: Mr. G. H. Barford, and the outcome of the gathering was that the Bedfordshire Football Association was started on its long journey. At the first meeting of the new body it was announced that nine clubs had become members of the Association, these nine being: Luton Town, Luton Gordon, Luton Excelsiors, Luton Falcon, Luton Victoria, Luton Montrose, Bedford Swifts, Markyate and Dunstable Town.

But this was only the starting point. Since that time the Association has steadily grown, until it now controls over 120 clubs and half-a-score of Leagues and Competitions. These words alone convey a tribute to the work of those gentlemen who have laboured long and hard for the general welfare of footballers and football lovers in our small county. The first President of the Association was Mr. G. H. Barford, and Mr. Frank Ebbs was the first gentleman to take over the reins of Secretaryship. He held this important post for over seven years. Mr. G. W. Walker took over the cares of office in 1901, and he served the Association for close upon nine years. Mr. A. E. Ansell is the present Secretary, and judging from present results it can be justly said that the Association has been happy and very fortunate in the election of its chief officers.

The past season was none the less successful than its predecessors. The clubs were as ever enthusiastic, and from a playing point of view we, in Bedfordshire, were well in the limelight of Southern amateur football, as our County players won their division in the Southern Counties Championship, and secured the honour of having to meet Essex in the semifinal. The fact that our players won divisional honours in their second year of competing, and the general enthusiasm which these County matches have aroused amongst the senior players of our County has quite justified the Council in entering this competition, notwithstanding that the financial experience of the experiment has not proved a very pleasant one. The matches do not attract that support from the public that they deserve, but in this respect we are in common with other Counties, as the general experience is that the matches do not pay their way. But the games wield a great influence for good in football circles, and notwithstanding their unfavourable influence o'er the exchequer, we cannot afford to drop them.

The prospects for the coming season look particularly promising. Season 1911-12 will witness the launching of the new Junior County Cup Competition. It is expected that this competition will arouse great interest amongst those clubs who have hitherto had little chance of shining in the Senior Cup Competition. The adopted rules will bar no club from entering a team in the competition. There will be no age limit for players, but the junior aspect of the competition has been safeguarded by certain regulations which will keep, what we may term, real senior players out of the running. One rule provides, "that no player who has played in a semi-final or a final round of the Senior Cup Competition will be eligible to take part in this competition." This and other similar rules which have been accepted will help to maintain the "junior" principles of the competition.


