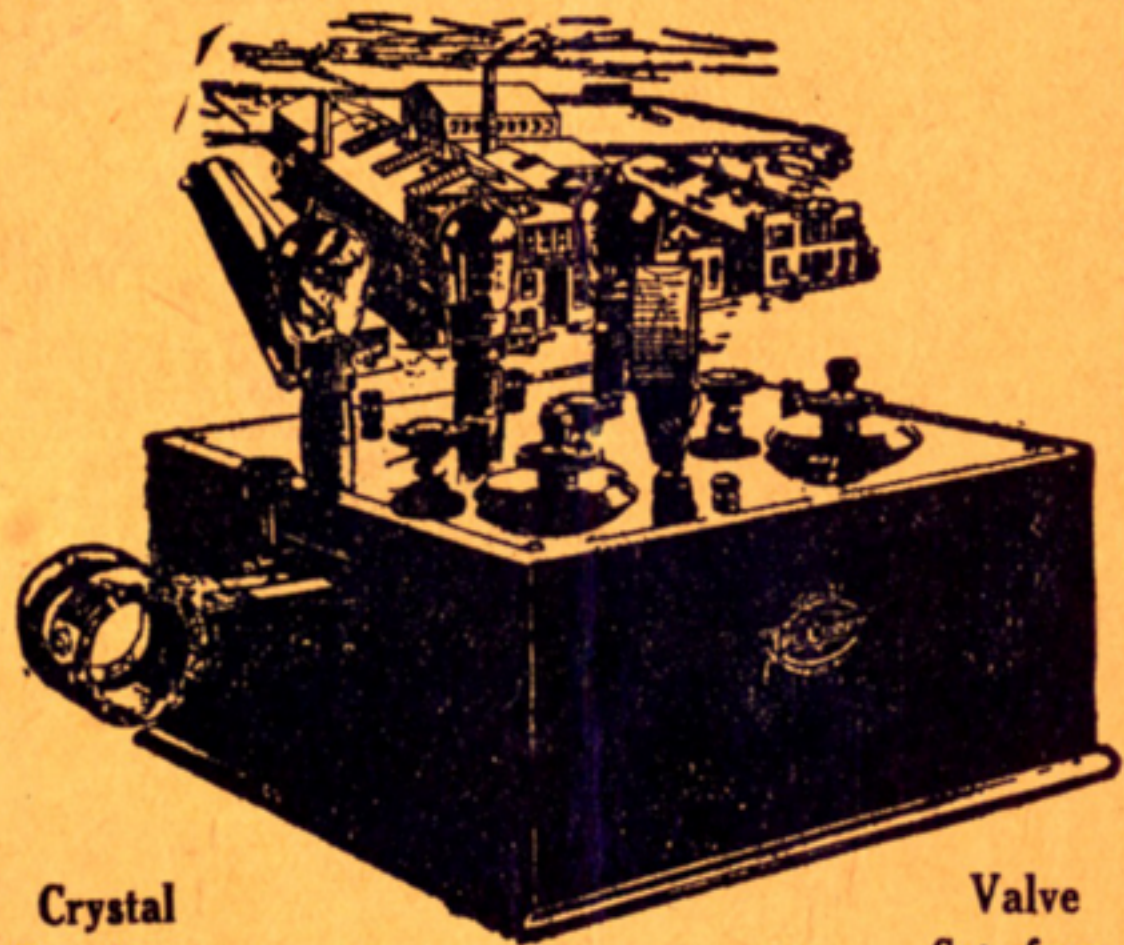

FOREWORD.

It is not often that Luton Town release so many players at the end of a season as they did in May last, but in doing so it is undoubtedly that the directors acted in consonance with the opinion of the supporters. It may also be said that the players also represent fairly accurately the general view of the most successful, or the least unsuccessful, of last season's players. Of those engaged no fewer than 15 were not retained, and there still remain vacancies to be filled. So far there have been engaged 10 new players, and from the aspect of physique there is a decided improvement.

All the new men come with good recommendations, and it is certain that in two departments there will be changes from the team that finished last season—goal and forward.

With Hoar transferred to The Arsenal there was no local player in the professional list, but with the signature of Mingay that deficiency is rectified.

Two important appointments have been made in Mr. George A. Thompson as manager, and Mr. W. A. Barr as trainer, and if they maintain their reputations this should be a happy and successful season. May the end of it bring the long hoped desire—promotion.

LEAGUE CLUBS' FINANCES.

Liverpool and Bury both had highly successful seasons financially in 1924-25 with profits of £9,000 and £8,104 respectively. West Ham United were able to show £6,100 on the right side of the ledger, Portsmouth £3,771, Crystal Palace £3,543 Tottenham Hotspur £3,213, Southend United £1,767. Sheffield United only made a profit of £2,746, against Manchester City's £4,163; other results being Port Vale £4,469, Wolverhampton Wanderers £3,502, Aston Villa £3,343, Preston N.E. £2,881, Sunderland £2,167, Newcastle United £1,724, and Everton £1,590. On the other side, Nottingham Forest have lost £3,024, Burnley £4,604, Sheffield Wednesday £3,265, Brentford £817, and Huddersfield Town, the League Champions, £456.
