JUBILEE YEAR.

ON April 11, 1885, a meeting was held at which a resolution was carried that "The Luton Town Football Club be formed." It arose from the amalgamation of two clubs, Luton Excelsior and Luton Wanderers. This, therefore, is the Jubilee Year of Luton Town F.C.

None of those responsible for the Club to-day took part in that memorable event, the oldest member of

the Board being Mr. Edward Mouse, who has twenty-one years service, and the next is Alderman S. H. Godfrey, who took office just after the war.

There is Alderman Harry Arnold as President, but his part is now restricted to that of spectator, and he does not intervene in the domestic affairs in any way. There are still among the supporters gentlemen who were closely identified with the Club in its first year, and these, not

less than the main body of supporters, will rejoice if the Jubilee Year is marked by the success that has so long been pursued, and has so long been deferred.

The present year opened with a compliment from the Football Association, for the Club secured exemption from the early stages of the F.A. Cup Competition; may it close with an honour from the Football League, in the shape of promotion.


During the year there has been the retirement from the Board of Mr. E. G. Gibbs, and the new member is Mr. Percy Mitchell, who has for many years been an enthusiastic supporter.

The erection of the Lane Stand has made a big difference to the comfort of the spectators, and within the next few months it is hoped to extend this to cover the whole of that side of the ground. If the desired success it attained during the season there may be further improvements

It is always dangerous to predict improvement in the playing strength, even in cases where big money is paid. This season the expenditure has not been on the scale of last season, and yet there is all round a feeling that the Club will turn out two teams as strong, and probably stronger, than in any season since the war.

It is not necessary to deal here with the recruits, for particulars appear elsewhere in this publication, but we should like to associate ourselves with the expression of the Chairman of the Club at the close of last season, in wishing all those who have not been re-engaged a happy situation elsewhere.

In conclusion it should be remembered by the supporters that it is consistency of support as well as consistency of play that helps to build the Club, and if this new season brings an increase equivalent to that of last season the end of the Jubilee Year will find the Club on a sounder and higher pedestal.

Luton Football Supporters Club

For two years the Supporters' Club was somewhat tottery, but during the last season splendid progress was made, and there is no question now that it is big asset to the club. In the first year £100 was raised; in the second £175; but this year the Town Club has received £262, and before the end of the current year it is hoped to augment that amount considerably.

A big effort is being made to enlist members, and it is hoped that the first month of the season will see the first thousand "signed on."

Many splendid efforts have been arranged for the winter season. Mr. Charles Conquest, who is responsible for the arrangements of the major share of the entertainments, has booked famous theatrical and B.B.C. artistes, and there will probably be a monthly concert at the Assembly Hall, in addition to other social events.
