

FOREWORD

FOR the second season in succession, the Town were involved in a struggle for retention of their Second Division status, which they achieved by an uncomfortably narrow margin of points.

That this was accomplished was due to a late rally that brought 12 badly needed points from 12 matches.

Once again, the main trouble was lack of scoring power in attack, but it was an encouraging sign that the scoring rate was up to nearly two goals a match during the last two months of the season.

On whether this promise can be continued during the early weeks of the new season will depend the sort of success the Town can expect and, although new signings have been few, there seems a sound foundation for the quiet spirit of optimism existing at Kenilworth Road.

THE CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

THAT our team was a much better combination than actual results showed was something that club officials were told very often on visiting grounds last season.

We could claim, quite justly I think, that luck did not run with us for long periods. On the other hand, there were weaknesses which we have sought to remedy and the search for players during the close season has been mostly concerned with forwards.

Lack of money has been a limiting factor in this respect and there was a slump in attendances last season which meant that only Chesterfield, in the Second Division, had a lower average gate than Luton.

However, we feel that the newly-signed players will fill the bill and that that, coupled with a progressive improvement by the younger players and a continuance of the more experienced members of the club in their best form, should enable us to look forward to a more successful season.
