## FOOTBALL HANDBOOK

SEASON 1958-59

### Town's Third Season In The First Division Was The Best

THAT their third season in the First Division turned out to be their best is a powerful argument in favour of the Town's policy which, broadly speaking, is the development of their own talent by coaching and training.

Although that is the broad basis of their plan, it is not one to which they have adhered to slavishly, because, when the necessity has arisen, they have spent big money, and their efforts during the close season to secure that badly-needed top-class winger is further evidence of that.

#### HANDICAP OF INJURIES

Had it not been for injuries which handicapped the club severely in the closing weeks of the season, the players would have stood a great chance of qualifying for the talent money for which they seemed to be destined at one time.

Injuries, particularly those to key players like Bob Morton and Allan Brown, were something that could not be surmounted successfully, and only six points came from the last 12 matches.

Unfortunately, the crop of injuries followed hard on the heels of the incident that provoked most argument and criticism during last season. That, of course, was the transfer of Reg Pearce to Sunderland for a reputed £20,000 fee.

#### ADEQUATE REPLACEMENTS

Pearce, in the running for an England cap at that time, had been one of the big successes of the season, and it was being freely said that the Town's main strength was in their middle line.

Why, then, did they accept the Sunderland offer? Answer given was that not only was support still way below



what it ought to be, and the money was needed, but the club felt that they had more than one adequate replacement for Pearce.

This was proved by the fine way in which Alwyn McGuffie and Dave Pacey, both youngsters, took their first-team chances, and no one could have anticipated that Morton would be laid aside for the rest of the season immediately Pearce had left.

### THAT CUP DISAPPOINTMENT

Will there be success this season? With all the players perfectly fit again, and attention to the wing positions, there seems no reason at all why the Town should not reach their stature of the period before Christmas.

That pipe-dream speedily disappeared in the mud at Edgeley Park, Stockport, where the Third Division team produced one of the sensations of the day by beating the Town 3—0.

Not only that, but they deserved it on the day's play, and that crushing blow was the disappointment of the season to the Town club. Yet, they showed fighting spirit in that they could come back and hold Wolves to a draw on their own ground the following week.

This season, the club should feel the benefit of their young players having had an extra year's experience, which should result in greater reserve strength and less disturbing results when the inevitable injuries come along.

### DEVELOPING YOUTH

We have the word of the Board that they will not hesitate to spend money in order to bolster up any department that needs it, but the main policy of developing youth remains, as was shown by the number of trial matches for local talent held during the summer.

On the knotty question of support, which is far below the First Division average, it was significant that aggregate attendances last season remained nearly constant, compared with the previous campaign.

But that meant, too, that the 63,000 supporters they lost after their first season in Division I did not return.

# TOWN'S BIG CAPTURE



**BILLY BINGHAM** (outside-right). Big Town capture after their bid to persuade Graham Leggatt, of Aberdeen, had failed. Bingham, Irish International, and one of the shining lights of his country's forward line, has always been impressive when playing against the Town, which was always regarded as a little ironical. Reason for this is not hard to find because the Town sought his signature when, as a youngster of 18, he was playing for the Belfast club, Glentoran. However, a Second Division club in those days, they could not compete with the glamour attaching to the Roker Park side and Bingham preferred to take his chance in the First Division. Now the wheel has turned full circle because Sunderland begin next season in Division II for the first time in their long history and the Town are in the First Division for their fourth season. The fee that changed hands was one running into five figures, and one of the biggest they have ever paid.

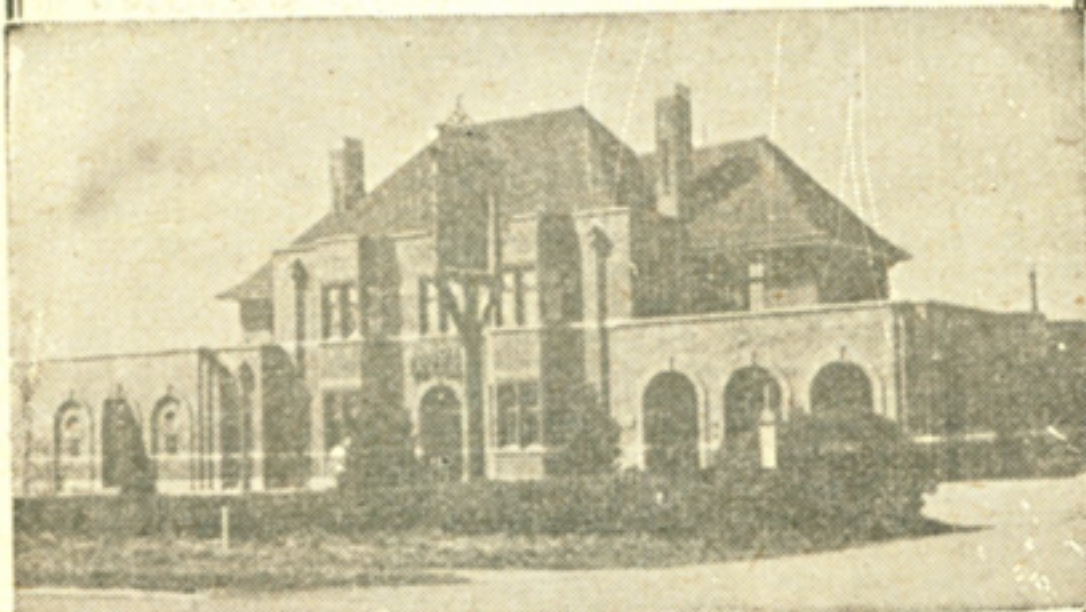

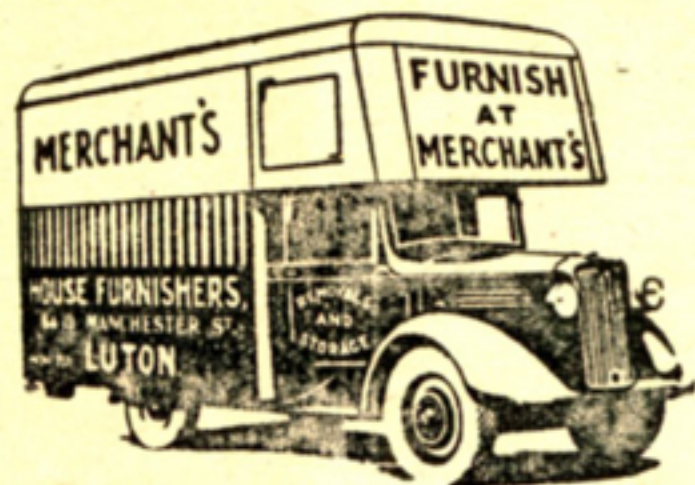

Was something of a forgotten man until near the end of last season when the Town had to face wing-half problems caused by the transfer of Reg Pearce to Sunderland and the injury to Bob Morton. McGuffie was brought in for the match at Birmingham on March 15 and kept the place for the remainder of the fixtures. Finished his apprenticeship at the end of the season and became a full-time professional for the first time. Definitely, he should benefit considerably from the extra training, but he is due for National Service, too, and this may call a halt to his promising career. 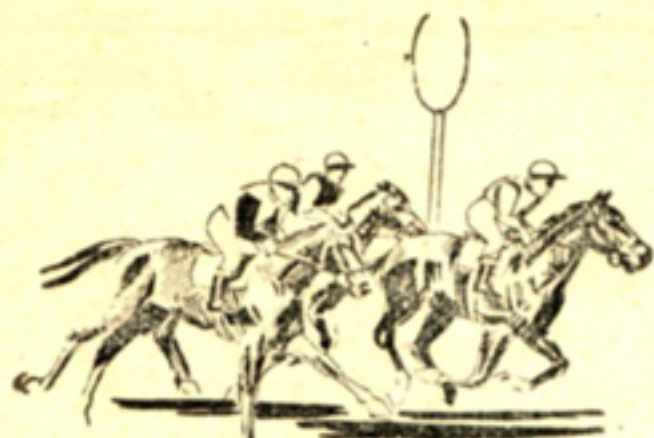

Remains something of an enigma because he has the natural ability to be one of the best wingers in the country and it is only his lack of finishing power that prevents just that. With more accuracy in his final use of the ball, he could have reached the top flight and played for his native Scotland. Although all his previous first team service was on the left wing, it was at outside-right that he was used mostly by the Town last season when he again showed ability to outwit the best full-backs, but mostly fell down when it came to finishing. Sampled Scottish League football before he crossed the border to join Spennymoor, to whom the Town paid quite a sizeable fee four years ago. Was dropped after Easter, but at the last moment was preferred to Michael Cullen, now with Grimsby, as a member of the tour party.



**BRIAN WHITBY** (outside-right). Made his debut in the League side at Newcastle on March 29 and had the distinction of scoring in his first game. Showed considerable promise in his first two or three outings and then, perhaps because he was becoming stale, rather fell away. Turner's 33 goals last season boosted his total in League matches to 146, obtained in 215 appearances, a remarkable record of consistency. was thought to hold a bright chance of inclusion in England's World Cup party, but was not chosen, though he was offered the consolation prize of a tour of Ghana and Nigeria with an F.A. party. Because the Town required his services in Germany, he declined the invitation. Has played for the Football League against the Scottish League and has been reserve for England "B," but that is as far as his talent has been recognised. Had never missed a penalty for the Town until during one of the games in Germany when the goalkeeper made a great save.



**BARRY HAWKES (inside-right).** Like Collier, is serving in Germany and is due for demobilisation early in the season when it is probable that he will be a full-time player. Before his call-up, he showed promise of developing into a good ball player and the Town had an opportunity of seeing what progress he has made when he turned out for them in the strange position, for him, of outside-left for the second half of one of the tour matches. Is a brother of Ken Hawkes and signed for the Town initially as an amateur after his family had moved south from the north-east.

**ALLAN BROWN** (centre-forward). One of the best inside-forwards in the game and also one of the unluckiest. Injuries have cost him several Scottish caps and, but for ankle trouble which prevented him from making his comeback in the national team against England at Hampden Park last April, would surely have gone to Sweden for the World Cup. His name was among the original 40 nominated, but omitted when the party to travel was announced. Injury prevented him playing in the first of the series of trials Scotland held last season, but he appeared in others quite impressively. The Town paid a five figure fee for him to Blackpool a year last February and he immediately pulled together a forward line that had been goal-shy.



**TONY GREGORY** (centre-forward). A local product who played for Bedfordshire's youth team, earned youth caps for England and was also a member of Bedfordshire's team in the Southern Counties Amateur Championship. Is beginning his fourth season with the club and has made 19 First Division appearances, six of them last season. Fast, with a hard and accurate shot, he may develop more rapidly when the time comes that he can join the staff as a full-time player and it is probable that part-time training is retarding his progress. Has played at outside-left with some success and although inside-left is his true position, it is mostly in the middle that the Town have used him in the Reserves.

When he came to Kenilworth-road as an amateur, he gave some good displays in the reserve team and then accepted professional terms. Is a local, who played for Sundon Park in Luton and South Beds League.



**TED DUGGAN** (inside-right). It is with the "A" team that this player now in the near-veteran stage is concerned in this, his second spell with the Town club. Then, his League appearances were limited to only 15. He took a long time to recover fully from a cartilage operation, but made a comeback to the International scene last season when he was recalled to Eire's team and went on tour with them during the summer.
