Memorable Happenings During Close Season

In many ways, so far as the Town were concerned, the close season was more memorable than was the playing season. During June came the shock news that Manager Sam Bartram was no longer connected with the club and, in the official statement, it was said that his appointment had been terminated by mutual consent.

A few days later, Bartram came out in a Sunday newspaper and said he had been sacked, following which we had the series of articles on the "I tell all" basis which we would have been better without, but which will cause the club no lasting harm.

There followed a difficult period in which the Town thought they had solved their manager problem by the acceptance of the job by their former trainer, popular Jack Crompton.

Unfortunately, without holding it a week and after making only a flying visit to the town, he decided on medical advice that it would be wiser not to go into the most precarious side of football.

When that decision was announced finally, July was upon the club, who then thought fast and offered the job to ex-Chelsea chief, Ted Drake, who had made a tentative application.

For a day or two, it seemed that everything was going smoothly and then Ted, who I am certain would have

been most popular here, decided that he did not want to give up his Wimbledon home.

Naturally enough, the Town baulked at the idea of having a manager living the best part of 40 miles away and negotiations broke down solely for this reason.

So, for the third time, the Town found themselves in the position of having to cast around for a successor to Bartram, with the result that the players came back to resume training with no manager in charge.

One can only hope that the unfortunate preliminaries to the season will not be reflected when the fixtures get under way. With all the uncertainty about the manager-ship, there have been no major signings, at the time of writing these notes—of necessity some time before the season is due to begin.

I cannot really think that the Town will have been content to begin the new season without having made a serious attempt to remedy the weaknesses that showed themselves in the attack during last campaign but, rightly, they took the view that the new manager should not be saddled with newcomers whom he had not had the opportunity of vetting.

Badly, Luton football needs a speedy shot in the arm this season because interest fell so much that the home League gate average last season slumped to 10,524, by far the lowest since the club first gained promotion to the Second Division.

That is about 4,000 below the economic level of subsistence and, indeed, there was a statement in mid-season that the club was losing £400 a week.

In view of the way in which players' wages were increased, without, I feel compensatory extra skill on the

field, this was not surprising and the only helpful factors were a donation of £6,000 from the Bobbers' Stand Club and something like £4,000 as the Town's share of the receipts from the three Cup-ties with Ipswich Town, which were the highlights of the season.

Obviously, such a state of affairs cannot obtain indefinitely. Outside competitions are helping to relieve the financial strain, but necessary though these may be, I have the feeling that a football club should be able to stand on its own feet, as indeed the Town have been able through a decade, without the aid of what can only be described as artificial stimulants.

Maybe, this is a sign of the times, but it is an unhealthy one and those connected with the club will not be happy until they can see the money taken through the turnstiles sufficient to meet their weekly commitments.

Not that the Town are the only club to find themselves in difficulties of this sort and only a handful are paying their way without the aid of outside interests.

Gates generally have dropped, but it must have come as a shock to the Town to find theirs falling so much, especially as their record up to the beginning of December was by no means bad and, indeed, was good enough to cause thoughts about regaining their place in the First Division.

After that, their bid faded out and much of the trouble could be pinpointed to the lack of a scheming inside-forward and striking power on the wings.

Nor could one be happy about the centre-half position until Terry Kelly was reinstated there, but the defence as a whole did a sound enough job, often in difficult circumstances.

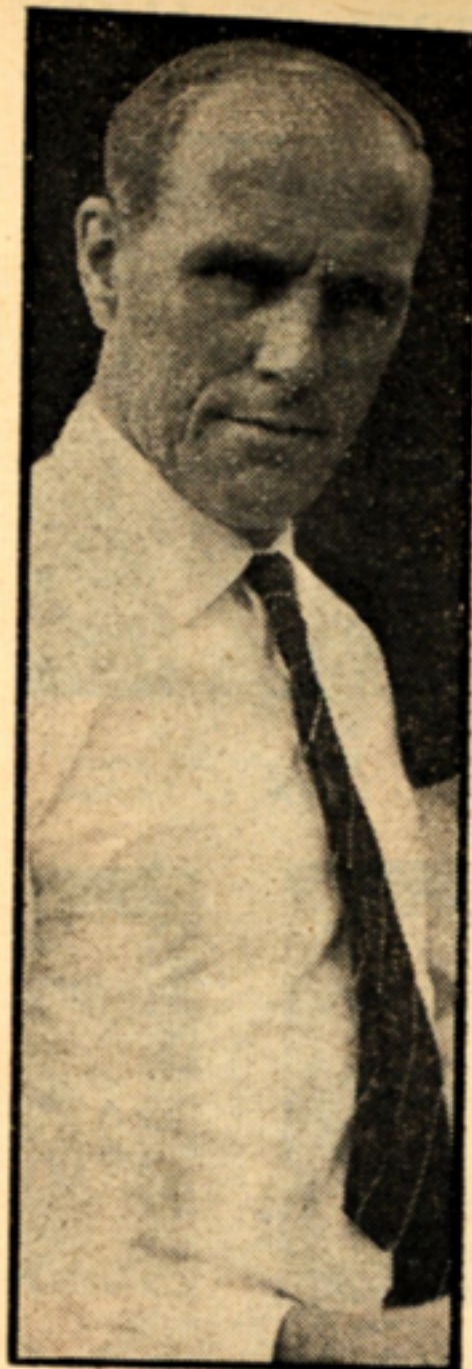

JACK CROMPTON. Even taking into account the highly expendable business of football management, Jack's association with the Town as their team manager was short-lived indeed. Appointed at the end of June, he decided less than a week later that it would not be wise for him to take the job after all, for health reasons. Apparently he has been suffering from ulcer trouble and was advised by a specialist that to take over as manager might aggravate the complaint. It was with the utmost reluctance that he came to his decision because he had been looking forward to resuming the association with the club with whom he had a spell as head trainer. More than that, the club were keenly disappointed because they have a lot of respect for Crompton who has been a great success as coach and trainer to Manchester United whom he rejoined almost immediately after the Munich disaster.

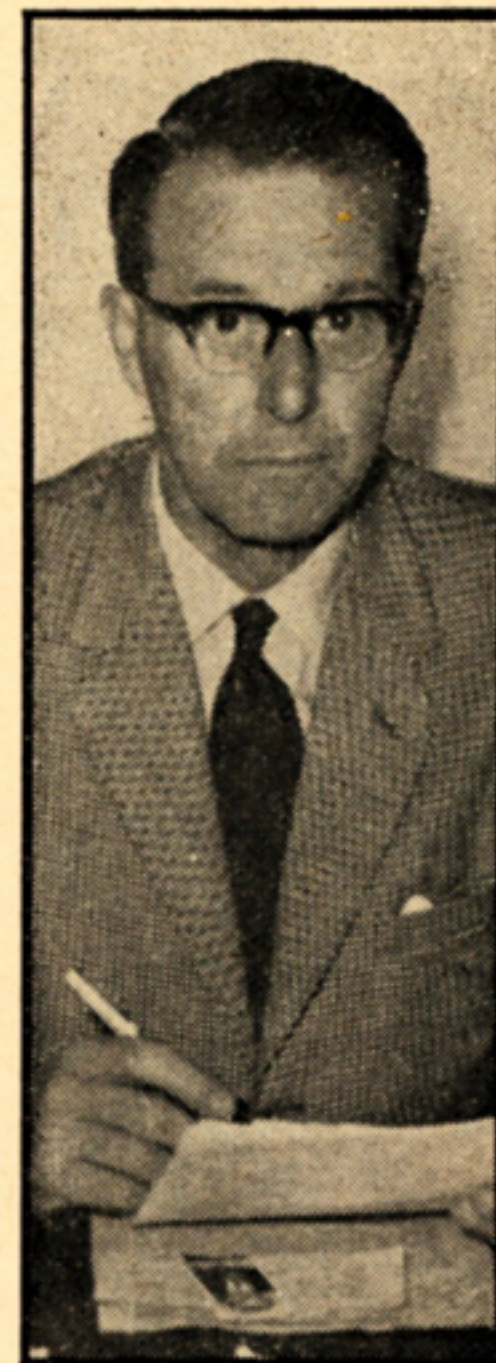

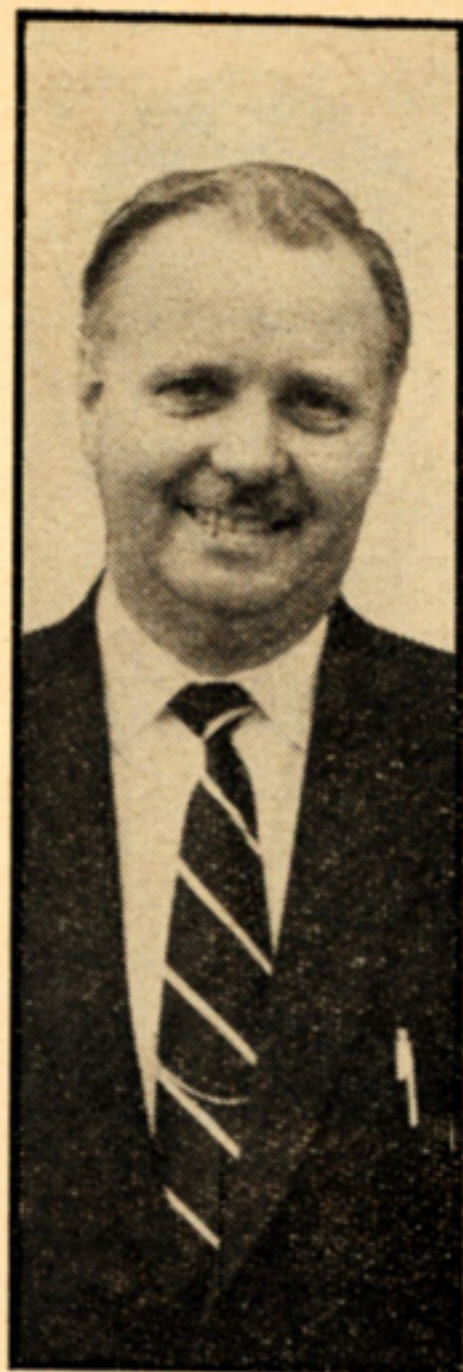

GEORGE MARTIN (Chief Scout). When after spending a number of years as manager of three different clubs, George finally broke with Aston Villa, he went into business in Liverpool and probably felt that his association with football was over. However, he came back into the game on a limited basis, doing a succession of scouting jobs for the Town in the north-west and worked for the club more regularly when he returned to Luton and took up employment with a local firm. Finally, he agreed to fill the vacancy at the club as full-time scout about three years ago. As a player, he had a distinguished career, serving Hamilton, Everton and Middlesbrough before ending his playing days at Luton. After that, he became the Town's coach and later, their manager. An attractive offer from Newcastle United tempted him to move to the north-east and, after a successful spell there, he moved to the Villa.

BOB READHEAD (assistant secretary). Has had an association with the Town club over 30 years, although it was not until a couple of years ago that he began to serve them in a full-time capacity. Then, when a vacancy in the office occurred, the Directors thought they would recognise his service by offering him what was virtually a new post. Before that Bob had done a lot of work for the club, chiefly in administration on the playing side and he had charge of the "A" team during most of the time they spent in the Metropolitan League. In that competition he was highly thought of and spent a long spell on their management committee. When he had to resign when the Town withdrew from the League, he was presented with an engraved plaque to mark his 11 years service. Is a keen student of the game and never misses an opportunity to see a match.

FRANK KING (trainer-physio-therapist). Strangely, the Town seem to favour former goalkeepers for jobs on their staff and Frank is the third ex-goalkeeper who has been trainer to the club since the war, the others being Jack Crompton and Harry Wright. Has had four years with the Town whom he joined from Leicester City where he was reserve team trainer. Comes from the north-east coast and played for the famous amateur club, Blyth Spartans, before being persuaded by Everton to go to Goodison Park when still in his early teens. Later, he had a spell with Derby County, but the war interrupted his career which was ended finally by an injury he received while playing for Southport as a guest. Although he severed his connection with the game temporarily after that, he came back into it as a trainer. Specialises in chiropody and has lectured on the subject on F.A. course at Lilleshall which he attends every summer.

TOM KING (Groundsman). Has had a long association with the Town because he joined them before the war as a full-back from Bournemouth, his signing being designed as a reinforcement for the promotion bid in Division III. That was successful and Tom did his part manfully. Like so many others, he found his career interrupted by the war and it was during a war-time regional match that he received the injury that caused him to hang up his boots for good. At that time, he was working in a local factory and, when normal football was resumed, he did some scouting for the club on a part-time basis. Later, a vacancy occurred for a groundsman and, remembering Tom's early background as a gardener on a big estate in Nottinghamshire, he was offered the job. Nor have the Town ever had reason to regret their decision because he has made a first-class job of looking after the Kenilworth-road pitch.

BARRY REED (right-back). Was a free transfer signing from Leicester City during the summer of 1961 and gave some useful service in the reserve team. Because of the consistency of McNally, he had only one chance in the League side when he did moderately well, but, generally, his form during the season did not suggest that he can be regarded as regular first team material. In fact, had he not been on a two years contract, he would have been given a free transfer because the Town announced that he would be allowed to leave if any club fancied him. Born in Peterborough, he was recruited by Leicester City from junior football there. At Filbert-street, he was kept in the background of the Reserves and, when a first team chance did occur, illness prevented him from taking it. Hallmark of his play is his coolness and good distribution, but he rather lacks "bite" in the tackle.
