# Need For Everyone To Pull Together To Restore Prestige Of The Town Club

FROM Cup Finalists in 1959 to relegation to the Third Division only four years later, is the unfortunate recent history of Luton Town.

Last season was the culmination of a falling away which, when one looks back, began before the Cup Final with Nottingham Forest but, perhaps because of the flush of success at that time, was not wholly recognised.

Recriminations and attempts to apportion the blame for the present state of affairs, there have been naturally enough, but the time is past for that kind of thing and what is needed now is for everyone to pull together in order to restore the club to some of its former glory.

That applies as much to the players, of whose spirit and form in practice there are good reports, as to those fans of the halcyon days who withdrew their support when things began to go wrong,

so that the club must have run at a heavy loss last season. Then, the average gate slumped to a mere 8,202,

Then, the average gate slumped to a mere 8,202, the worst for quite 25 years. Only an aggregate of 172,257 went to Kenilworth-road last season compared with 358,416 in the last season in the First Division which shows the measure of the loss of enthusiasm.

Immediate aim must be to draw some of the reluctant fans back to the terraces in order to restore the club's financial position. In trying to re-build for the coming campaign, they have been impeded by shortage of money, which has been aggravated by the fact that other clubs have not come forward for the players they are willing to transfer.

Among these are Ron Cope, £10,000 signing from Manchester United, and Danny Clapton, for whom Arsenal collected £6,000 last September and who, for one reason or another, played in only 10 League games.

However, the Town managed to find a five figure fee for Gordon Fincham, of Plymouth Argyle, a centre-half whom they hope will fill the gap left by the retirement of Sid Owen.

Fincham could bring a new stabilisation to the defence which conceded too many goals last season, though often, particularly in away matches, they had to bear the brunt of the ineptitude of the men in the front line.



Manager Bill Harvey whose task it will be to try to guide the Town back to the Second Division. He begins his second year with the club perhaps better equipped from the point of view of playing strength than was the case when he took over a little more than 12 months ago.

Another useful reinforcement to the defence has been obtained in Allan McBain, who came from Carlisle United in exchange for Alan Ross and Jack Lornie, and he has been playing most impressively in practice.

There seems to be sufficient cover in defence and the burning question seems to be whether the inside-forward resources are adequate. Only newcomer in this department is Gareth Salisbury whom Norwich City released at the end of the season and it remains to be seen whether he can reach senior team status.

Strenuous efforts to find a firstclass inside-left, both during last season and during the summer, have failed and, perhaps, the biggest disappointment was over the decision during last term of David Burnside to go to Southampton instead of coming here.

However, in Harry Walden, who missed the last 12 matches which

was probably a big factor in the final relegation, and Ron Davies, whom the Town have kept in the face of some difficulty, they have two match-winning forwards.

Much of the Town's hopes for a quick return to the Second Division rests with the attack and their sore need for increased support will obviously depend a great deal on what sort of a start they make.

Their opening programme is not easy because Saturday's home game with Walsall is followed by three away and the Third Division tends to be a very hard school indeed.

However, the Town are experienced, with more than half their team for the opening match having played in First Division football, and this could well be a determining factor.

Portsmouth made the step back in one with perhaps less pure football ability than the Town have at their disposal and, despite the evidence of the League table, I still feel that Luton were not the worst in the Second Division last season.

Greatest need seems to be more determination away from home and it was the record on tour that, overall, brought the final disaster.



# RON BAYNHAM (goalkeeper)



Reached the milestone of 300 League appearances for the Town during last season when he missed only three first team matches. This will be his 13th year with the club whom he joined from Worcester City and he has won top honours in the game with England caps against Ireland, Denmark and Spain. Went with England on their South American tour four years ago, but was not given a game, Is probably the only goalkeeper playing at the moment who has appeared at centre-forward.



Has been signed as understudy to Baynham, but is an experienced player who made 44 League appearances for Exeter City last season. Before he went to the Devon club, he had played for Darlington and Grimsby Town and Luton signed him on the recommendation of Cyril Spiers, himself a former goalkeeper with Aston Villa, who was manager of Exeter for a part of last season. Has had sufficient background in senior football to relieve Manager Bill Harvey of the worry he felt for much of the summer.



Now that Brendan McNally has left the club, the way seems clear for him to start the season in the first team, as he would have finished it but for a bad ankle injury that caused him to miss the last match. Received his chance of regular service when McNally was injured at Derby and played well enough to stay in the side. Son of a former Town player who was with the club just after the war, he can play on either flank with equal facility.

Last season brought a break in the long string of consecutive League appearances he had put together since joining the Town from Everton as part of the Billy Bingham deal. Even so, he has missed only four games out of 114. Had an uneasy patch during last campaign which caused him to lose his place for a short time, but he came back with renewed confidence. Born at Ashton-in-Makerfield, he went to Wigan Athletic for his first professional engagement and Everton took bim from there.

ALLAN MCBAIN (left-back)



A newcomer who has been showing such bright form in private trial matches that he must be regarded as a contender for a first team place. Well built Scot, he crossed the border to join Carlisle United and his name went in Manager Bill Harvey's book after he had watched him last season. When Carlisle became interested in the Town's Alan Ross and Jack Lornie, the manager was happy to settle for McBain in a straight exchange deal. Strong in the tackle, he shows a liking for trying to use the ball.

BOB MORTON (right-half)



Has set up the mammoth total of 462 League appearances during his 17 seasons with the Town and was playing well enough during last campaign to suggest that he will reach the 500 mark. A local product, he has been an adaptable player who has occupied eight different positions in the Town's first team. In all probability this very adaptability caused him to miss the ultimate honour of an England cap because he was chosen as travelling reserve twice, but he did play for the "B" team.

GORDON FINCHAM (centre-half)



The Town's major signing of the close season for he came from Plymouth Argyle at a fee reputed to be in the region of £10,000. Born in Peterborough, he went to Leicester City where he had some first team service before being transferred to Plymouth five years ago. There he was rejoined by a former Leicester team-mate, Johnny Newman, a centre-half who had been converted into a left-half. However, last season Newman went into the middle again and Fincham lost his first-team place.

DAVE PACEY (left-half)



A local who was a member of Luton School-boys team, he was with Hitchin Town when the Town offered him terms and he has given them valuable service in all three wing-half positions. There have been various attempts to convert him into an inside-forward, stemming from his obvious liking for attack, but they have never achieved complete success. At one time he was in line for top honours and played at centre-half for England "B" against Germany "B".

ALWYN McGUFFIE



Last season was a better one for him in terms of first team appearances because he chalked up 21 against only seven in the previous term. Originally, he was brought into the team as the midfield link-up at insideleft, something that had been practised assiduously in the pre-season preparation. That did not work so well as had been hoped, though it did at Middlesbrough when the Town gained their solitary away win of the season. Later, he had quite a good spell at wing-half.

HARRY WALDEN (outside-right)




In all probability the bad knee injury he received in the home match with Middlesbrough on March 25 which caused him to miss the last 14 matches, was a considerable factor in the Town's final relegation. At the time he was playing brilliantly and his presence at this vital period might well have been invaluable. Now fully recovered, his speed and cleverness should be a matter of torment to Third Division defences this season. Began his professional career with Kettering Town in the Southern League.

MIKE FAIRCHILD (outside-right)



Has had three seasons with the Town during the course of which he has made only eight League appearances, seven of them during last campaign. In addition, he played in the League Cup-ties at Southport and Barnsley in both of which he acquitted himself well. Is still young enough to improve to regular first-team standard, and his goahead style should help him, though his finishing needs improvement. Born in East Anglia, he played for Lowestoft Town.

GORDON TURNER (inside-right)



Was one of the players offered only minimum terms at the end of last season and the only one of them who has signed two monthly contracts. On that basis he will be available for the start of the season and the Town may well need his services. In 13 seasons here, he has made 379 League appearances and scored over 200 goals, his tally last season being 14. When he first came to Luton in 1950 he was a right-half but was converted into an inside-right after his liking for attack had been noted.

MATT BRENNAN (inside-forward)



One of the Town's hopes for the future, he was blooded in the home match with Cardiff City on April 24 when he made an encouraging debut and against Plymouth on the following Saturday he scored a great goal. Was troubled by injury afterwards, but made four League appearances in all. He played for St. Roch, a Glasgow junior club, when the Town spotted him, and signed him at the end of the season before last. A youngster, he could well reap the benefit this year of the experience he has had.

RON DAVIES (centre-forward)



Fans spent much of the summer wondering whether they had seen the last of Davies in the colours of the Town because he asked for a transfer, but was turned down. Then, when he signed only a monthly contract, the Town said that they would be willing to listen to any offers that would interest them. None did and the upshot was that Davies signed for the season on August 1. Signed from Chester last October for £10,000, Davies built up a big reputation by his scoring feats last season when he had 21 goals. To Notwich 419163 for £35,000

GARETH SALISBURY (inside-left)



A close-season signing from Norwich City who released him at the end of last campaign. A Welshman, he had his first professional experience with Wrexham, and he is a former Youth International. The then Norwich manager, George Swindin, signed him just over 12 months ago on the recommendation of another ex-Wrexham insideforward, Aarfon Griffiths, then with Arsenal. However, he did not receive a first-team chance at Norwich because of keen competition.

TOMMY McKECHNIE (inside-left)



Did not maintain his form of the previous season when he was a regular and scored 10 goals in 33 games. Was troubled at one time by injury and his first-team appearances were limited to 20, some of them at outsideleft, He seemed to have lost the knack of goal-getting because he scored only once, and the Town must hope that he will regain his form of his first season. A Scot, he had a short spell with Glasgow Rangers, but was reinstated as a junior and then played for Rob Roy.

GORDON RIDDICK (inside-left)



Made a highly promising debut in the first team at Rotherham on the Friday before Christmas, but did not really maintain it and was left out after having appeared in four League games and the Cup-tie against Swindon. However, he played some splendid games for the Reserves and the official view is that he has a considerable future in the game, especially as he is not yet 20. Comes from Abbots Langley and was signed initially as an amateur after playing in a trial match.

FREDDIE JARDINE (outside-left)



Was in and out of the team last season when he put up some impressive displays, but was scarcely consistent. Another Scot, he has had two seasons with the Town after having been given a free transfer by Dundee. This caused some surprise and led the Town's Scottish scout to recommend him. Several times he has seemed to be on the point of leaving Luton, but although several clubs were keen to sign him at various times, he has never agreed to move.
