

Dear Supporters,

Sports broadcasting is an obsession—I remember earning my apprenticeship in local radio at BBC Radio Oxford. I started out by making the tea, answering telephone calls and editing tapes. I was alright at most things — but according to some tea making is still a weak point.

The first ever football match I reported on was some nine years ago. The date April the 1st. The highlight so far is undoubtably Luton's victorious Littlewoods Cup final, as part of the team working for Radio Bedfordshire on the day. It seems a million miles away from that first match — on a wet and windy night, Banbury United were playing Oxford City and the press box basically a garden shed on stilts. Experience in broadcasting is vital — trying to work out who had scored a particular goal was difficult, the window inside was always

steaming up and there was rain falling on the outside of the window.

Visibility was pretty difficult then, but trying to report on a match when fog suddenly engulfed the ground and one of the team's scores a goal — that is a different problem. Strangely enough that particular ground held other problems. The groundsman was keen to save money and more than once half way through my full time report using the extensive notes you make during a match — off went every light in the ground. Fortunately I usually remembered to take a torch with me — there was one occasion I forgot and half way through off went all the lights. I remember garbling "Oh dear, all the lights have gone off — the score was 2-1, full details in our later programme".

Believe me reporting from Wembley is tremendous in comparison and far easier.

As a visitor at the last Supporter's Club evening when Terry Mancini was the special guest — I was very interested to hear Terry's thoughts on the press. It seems to me that the Fleet Street tabloids give us all a bad name — but as the meeting proved people's views on players, managers and indeed matches differ widely. I am always available for your comments at BBC Radio Bedfordshire on any subject. We are often accused of not being accessible — but please feel free if you think our coverage could be improved or is unfair, or

hopefully if you enjoy it and always listen.

Unfortunately it seems that television and the ridiculous sums they are prepared to pay the likes of Liverpool/ Arsenal/Manchester United etc now have more say than the paying spectators, who persistently have to put up with being treated as second class citizens with poor viewing facilities.

Enough about that, and to the Half Fare Bus Travel Offer to Luton

Bruce Rioch

One of the most popular and successful players to come out of local football, Bruce, was a firm favourite with the Luton crowd and a regular goal scorer with many of his goals coming from his powerful shots from well outside the penalty area.

An inside-forward he joined Luton Town in 1964 and made 148 appearances, scored 47 goals and was only substituted once in that period. A transfer to Aston Villa with his brother Neil who was on the Town's books, saw him win his first Scottish International cap.

From Villa he moved to Derby County, Everton before trying his hand in the North American Soccer League with Seattle. On his return to this country he signed for Torquay United and later became their manager. The

list of managers that he played under during his playing career reads something like a soccer who's who.

At Luton Town he played under Bill Harvey, George Martin, Allan Brown and Alec Stock. At Aston Villa it was Tommy Docherty and Vic Crowe. At Everton Billy Bingham and Gordon Lee. At Seattle he played under Alan Hinton and at Derby County it was Dave Mackay, Tommy Docherty again, Colin Murphy and Colin Addison. During his international spell in which he won over 20 Caps with Willie Ormond and Ally McLeod in charge.

At Torquay United before taking charge himself Mike Green and Frank O'Farrell were the men in the hot seat.

That is a total of 17 managers. His Transfer fees totalling £600,000. Bruce says that the major highlight of his career was winning the Fourth Division Championship with Luton Town in the season 1967/68.

After a short while working as an Insurance Clerk within a Midland Insurance Company he has become a recognised Football Manager once again with now Second Division Middlesborough. He was involved early this season with the transfer fiasco of Gary Pallister to Manchester United. But is hoping to put the money of 2.3 million to good effect for a speedy return to the top flight.


The 92 Club was set up in 1978 to recognise the achievements of those who have attended every Football League Ground in England & Wales for a First Team match.




