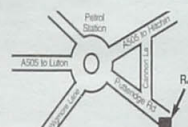

Newell: Now for the title

Mike talks to Luton on Sunday about his desire to win the league

LUTON Town manager Mike Newell says his side are still focused on winning the League One title, even though they have already been promoted.

Speaking after Thursday morning's training session at Luton Rugby Club he told *Luton on Sunday* journalist Martin Buhagiar: "There's no doubt about it, the players are 100 per cent focused on winning the league, winning promotion won't stop that."

"In the end I was glad we were promoted by way of Brentford beating Tranmere because it meant there were no huge celebrations like there would have been had we won a game and then got promoted."

"Obviously it is going to be great when we play MK Dons and I am sure the fans will enjoy it, but we know we've still got a job to do." Asked whether he had set out to win the league at the start of the season, Newell added: "At the beginning of the season I was confident we could do something. We brought in a few players like Paul



Underwood at the end of the previous season and Marlon Beresford and Rowan Vine and that was good because before that I couldn't bring any new faces in. We had lost Boycie and Matthew Spring, who were top players for us, and we

needed to make a few additions to the squad. We were able to offer new contracts to players already at the club and the new owners came in and backed us all the way. "I felt we had been unlucky the season before and, looking at the

teams who went up last year (QPR and Plymouth Argyle) I personally didn't think they were any better than us."

"I knew we had a great team spirit here and after the first six games we were still unbeaten and I felt we could go on and get automatic promotion."

"We were not getting beaten which was important and I wanted the players to keep that mentality. Not the winning mentality but the not getting beaten mentality, if you like."

Now Newell knows he will be taking his side to face the likes of Leeds United, Wolverhampton Wanderers, and possibly West Ham, Crystal Palace and Norwich City. So what are his hopes for next season?

"I haven't set any targets for next year," he said. "I don't want to go into a new league and say if we stay up it's a good season because if we are fourth or fifth from bottom people might start thinking that's a good season and relax."

"I want to go up and just see how far we can go and see what we can do."

"If you look again at the likes of QPR and Plymouth they have both more or less held their own and haven't made that many additions to the squad."

"I won't be setting the team any targets. In fact my only target at the moment is to win League One."

Pivotal moments

THE 2004/5 season could not have started any better for Luton Town until October 16 when the league leaders suffered their first defeat, at home to Huddersfield. A blip, we said.

Hatters then lost their first away game at Walsall three days later. You can't win them all, we said. Then, to compound a crummy week, Hatters lost 3-0 at Hull and suddenly a blip had turned into three defeats in seven days.

Luton's response? To dish out a thrashing - with Bradford City the unwitting victims.

Goals from Steve Howard, Paul Underwood and a brace from Ahmet Brkovic - including a goal of the season contender - answered any doubts critics had about Luton's staying power.

A buoyant Mike Newell beamed: "People will see what Luton Town are made of after this win. It was frustrating to lose three in a row, but the players proved today what they are made of. On our day we can

Newell publicly backed Harford after the game saying: "We'll miss him and we wish him all the luck in the world. He's made a massive contribution to this club and to the squad we've now got here."

Feelings are still mixed over Harford who was released from Forest when Kinnear was axed a month later. He returned with Swindon as assistant to another ex-Hatter, Andy King, in March and watched his former side cruise to a 3-1 win.

Although he couldn't show it on the outside, you got the impression he rather enjoyed seeing how far his Hatters had come.

The result was given added perspective when the BBC finally aired its 'Trouble At The Top' documentary mid-week. The programme lifted the lid on the John Gurney farce.

But Hatters seemed to have put the dark days off the pitch behind them and with Newell - the one positive legacy of the Gurney era - were making the headlines for all the right reasons.

MICK Harford is a Luton Town legend.

His gutsy performances in a white shirt made the big striker the darling of the terraces in the 80s and early 90s.

He's also a very good coach - or Director of Football - and together with Mike Newell the pair were leading Luton to the top. But before this clash with Wrexham that duo had been broken up.

Harford answered the call from former Hatters' boss Joe Kinnear at struggling, fallen giants Nottingham Forest to be his number two and sadly left Luton.

His untimely departure upset a lot of loyal fans who had idolised him as a player and appreciated his undoubted coaching ability.

But Luton showed that it would be business as usual on the pitch with this thumping victory which did as much for morale as it did for their promotion push.

He quite rightly talked up his hard-working side who had silenced the Ashton Gate crowd despite having many first team regulars out. This didn't stop Luton taking the lead through Chris Coyne's powerful header from a Paul Underwood cross.

Leroy Lita equalised for the hosts just after the hour mark but Hatters weren't content with a point. Instead they pushed forward and gave everything in the pursuit of victory. It came one minute from time when Showunmi (in for suspended top-scorer Steve Howard) got one of his long legs to another Underwood cross.

Newell's men showed big spending City that money can't buy you promotion - but teamwork can.

'Back on top'

HAVING led League One since beating Torquay United on August



21 it was a real sickener to see Hull on top after two successive draws, with Sheffield Wednesday and Peterborough, let Luton's championship rivals catch up. This was put right against the Hatters of Stockport through goals from Chris Coyne, Steve Howard and a penalty from skipper Kevin Nicholls.

It also made up for the previous week's FA Cup third round exit against Brentford when Hatters had a rare off day.

"We had a chat about what we could have done better last Saturday and it was evident today that we've learnt from our mistakes," explained Mike Newell. "I was unhappy at going out of the FA Cup - although it might be a blessing in disguise if we can concentrate on promotion."

Aussie defender Coyne got things started with a close range volley two minutes from half time and hot-shot Howard grabbed Luton's second on 54 minutes. Nicholls converted a spot kick on 72 minutes but Luton could have had five or six.

Stockport would later be relegated but Luton's apparent ease in a routine win showed that the Hatters had simply outgrown most of the opposition in League One - and were ready for a new challenge.

CAN you have a championship



decider in the middle of February? Mike Newell and Hull City boss Peter Taylor certainly didn't think so - with Newell insisting it was 'just another three points in a tight league' and Taylor pointing out that there were still 16 games to go.

But try telling Hatters fans that after a capacity crowd savoured this sweet victory over their title rivals. Luton left it late - Ahmet Brkovic swooped in the 89th minute between two defenders to head home a deserved winner - but there was no doubting Hatters had dealt Hull a huge psychological blow in the race for the championship.

The Tigers looked toothless compared to Luton who attacked from the off showing their nearest competitors just who deserved to be top with crisp passing movements and calm defending.

But Hatters couldn't find that finishing touch in the final third - until the Croatian Sensation pulled out his party piece at the death to send the Kenilworth Road crowd into raptures.

Newell was clearly overjoyed at the final whistle. "They (Hull) can have no arguments - we were by far the better team. The players are all delighted in the dressing room, but I'm not getting too carried away."

MANY of Luton's points amassed on the road have been down to Mike Newell's men's never say die spirit.

Hatters have only lost four games away from Kenilworth Road this season and Newell has often explained that his team simply won't be beaten.

That philosophy was never more evident than two weeks ago on the South Coast.

Bournemouth, in a play-off position, had comprehensively beaten Luton 6-3 in last season's corresponding fixture.

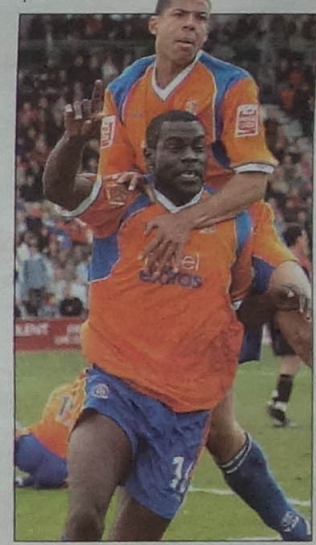
Their cause this season was helped even more when Hatters were reduced to ten men after just 21 minutes when Russ Perrett was sent off for a professional foul.

But Luton won the game through substitute Enoch Showunmi's scrambled strike six minutes from time - and no-one was surprised.

Despite the Cherries' numerical advantage, Luton's disadvantage spurred them on even more. Bournemouth were played off the park at times and, sensing the home side's tension, Newell bought on two strikers to win the game.

Afterwards, with automatic promotion all but tied up, Newell spoke of the players' desire for the League One title.

"All my thoughts are on winning this division. I'd be majorly disappointed if we weren't crowned champions now."
