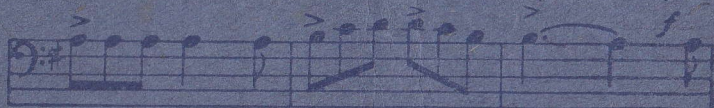

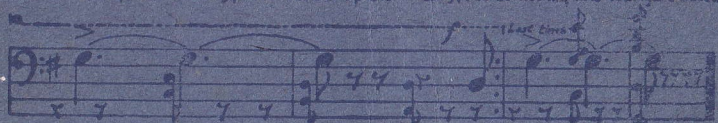

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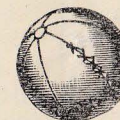

Rangers Chatter.

By "THE MAN ON THE SPOT."

At last I have the pleasure of recording an away victory, for the boys picked up two most valuable points at Norwich where they won by a goal to nil last Saturday.

Only twice previously this season have the Rangers garnered the full spoils on opponents' territory. One was on Boxing Day at Watford when we won by the odd goal in three. It must not be forgotten, however, that Watford had won at Shepherd's Bush two days before by four goals to two. We also won at Aberdare, 2—0.

With Norwich it was quite a different matter. Having beaten the Canaries by such a decisive margin as four clear goals at Shepherds Bush last November the victory last Saturday gave the Rangers their second "double" of the season. Aberdare was the other club which was compelled to deliver up all four points.

Our victory at Norwich was well merited. The team enjoyed much the better of the game during the opening half and it was during this period that the all-important goal was scored. Lofthouse—a very regular

scorer for an extreme wingman — obtained the point. Well done Johnny! Two other goals were scored by Goddard, but both were disallowed for alleged infringements. After the interval Norwich were more aggressive and our defenders were given a fairly strenuous time. The home side fought desperately to level matters but all their efforts failed. Our goal was not to capitulate because the Rangers defenders fought every inch of the ground. They had every opportunity to show their capabilities and they came out of a trying test with all the honours. Individual mention is somewhat out of place but if I say that Jack Young, who returned to the side at left back after a lengthy period, was an outstanding success it will not cast any reflection on the other defenders. They did splendidly and each pulled his full weight to gain the desired reward.

This victory lifted us out of those two last dreaded places, but we are still hovering close to the wrong end of the table. If the team continues to play with the same spirit and cohesion as last Saturday I do not think there will be any doubt about avoiding the humiliation of having to seek re-election. Don't forget we have five home and only three away games before this season's programme is concluded.

The Reserves gained a splendid success against Cardiff City at Loftus Road, the Welsh club being beaten by no fewer than five clear goals. It was not anticipated that our second string would have such an easy journey but they showed fine form against their Welsh visitors—who, by the way, were making their first visit to the Bush—and the Rangers' victory was well deserved in every way. The goals were scored by Wilcox (2), Young, Burgess and

Charlesworth. Although Miller was the only forward who did not actually score, more than one goal was due to his clever work on the left wing. After all it does not matter who gets the goals as long as they are got. Cardiff City, by the way, included in their team at outside right E. Curtis, one of their regular First team, who had been on the injured list and who is expected to appear in their Cup Final team at Wembley. In this game also the Rangers gave a trial to Thomas Nixon, a new right back from Crawcrook Albion, the club from which Mustard joined the Rangers this season. The latest comer is only 19 years of age and is well-built. He stands 5ft. 10in. and weighs 11st.
