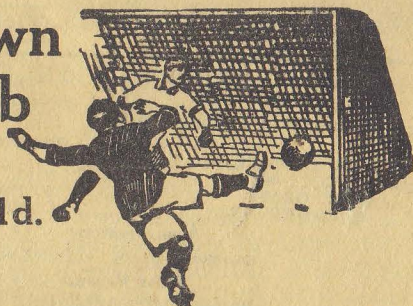

SWINDON v LUTON.

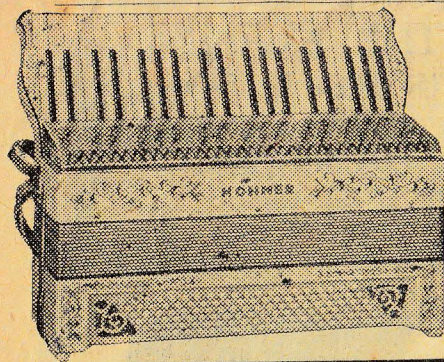
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CLUB NOTES.

THE Town's win at Aldershot has heartened everybody. It was a fine victory, well and truly earned by a display of entertaining football. Several Swindon players shone—none more than Nixon and Flanagan. Nixon has had to occupy several positions, both in the first team and the Reserves. He has never failed to render a good account of his stewardship. In the absence of his captain he figured in the centre-half berth at Aldershot, with entirely satisfactory results. Lambie is such an outstanding player in the team that to fill the captain's usual position with so much success is a distinct credit to Nixon.

Flanagan's game at outside left was about his best for Swindon, so far. He was in sparkling form. Strangely enough, Aldershot's outside left, Lee, was also the most prominent forward on his side. All the goals came from the left wingers.

This victory enabled the Town to maintain the ninth position in the League table. What a splendid contrast to the lowly place in which the Town found themselves at this time last season! Will to-day's visit by Luton produce another pair of points? It will be remembered that the Town won an unexpected victory at Luton earlier in the season by 3—2. Mr. Vizard was hopeful of being able to field the eleven who triumphed at Aldershot.

The Luton players can be relied upon to afford a splendid struggle. The "Hatters" never fail to serve up a great game at the County

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Ground. The crowd will expect the two points to stay at Swindon, but they can be assured of one thing—Luton won't yield them without a gallant fight. The Town's forwards will have to accomplish some straight and hard shooting to "bring off the double."

Many's the day since visitors to the County Ground have been treated to such a delightful exhibition of skilful football as that given by Kirkwood when playing for the Reserves against Street. The halves and backs of the Street team are not likely to forget the bewildering brilliance of his dribbling. It was real football of the highest class. Every spectator was thrilled, and the hundreds of schoolboys who had been watching the Reading and Swindon schools' teams and stayed to the Reserves' match could not have had a better lesson.

Their substantial victory by 8—2 over Street enabled the Reserves to hold top place in the Western League. But they will have to play hard to preserve that exalted place. The sprightly Weymouth side are only two points behind with four games in hand. Bath City Reserves are also right on Swindon's heels.

Haddleton, playing at centre forward for the Reserves, shot four good goals, besides two off-siders. He had a good match. Strong, the new left wing player from Pewsey, was much in evidence with really good play. He is thoughtful and deliberate, and showed a decided ability to hold the ball when necessary.

The remarkable part of the Reserves' team was the half-back line. It consisted of a full back and two forwards, all of whom did quite well in their unwonted positions.

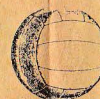
